The Estill County Lady Engineers put another 56th District Tournament Championship trophy on the shelf this past week as they defeated the Lady Pirates of Powell County by the score of 12-2.

The final score would be a little deceiving as this would be a tight game until the final inning. Estill would open the scoring in the third inning when L. Wood would lace a RBI single to right and two batters later, S. Wiseman would drive the ball to the wall for a run scoring double.

Powell's defense would let them down in the fifth

inning with a two run error and push Estill's lead to 4-0.

Powell would put the pressure back on the Ladies with a two run sixth inning but a L. Isfort double in the bottom half of the sixth would get one of the runs back. S. Wiseman would deliver a bases clearing hit and push the lead to 8-2. Estill would pile on four more runs for the mercy rule and grab the trophy for the 13th consecutive time as 56th District Champions!

The game was a lot closer than most predicted as Estill's offense sputtered early on.

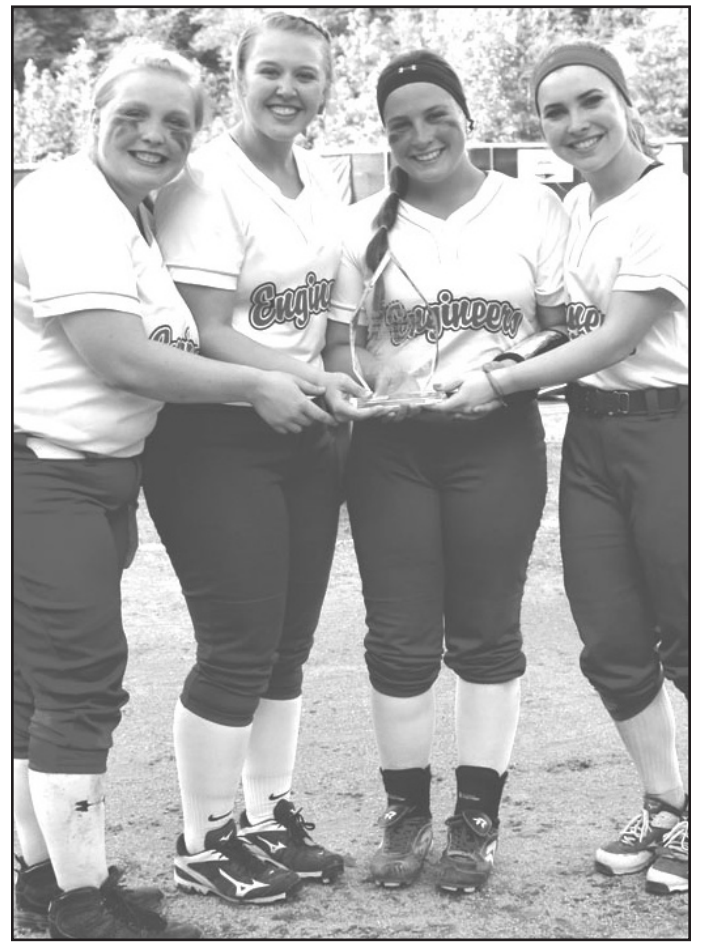
K. Covey's pitching would keep LCC's offense handcuffed all game long as she sat down 15 batters via the strikeout. Estill would

Irvine Police charge 5 with trafficking in illegal drugs

Sturniolo was assisted with the investigation by KSP Trooper Ty Robinson.

On Wednesday, May 23, Irvine Police arrested two men in the parking lot of Price Less Foods on Winchester Road.

An informant called in the tip of illegal activity taking place in the parking lot.

Sgt. Sturniolo said when he arrived, the occupants acted suspicious. A rear passenger jumped out and ran into the store when police arrived on the scene.

Irvine's K-9 alerted on the vehicle, which the driver gave permission to search.

He charged William Cornett, 32, of Poplar Street, Ravenna with trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense.

Sturniolo said Cornett had a vial of folded pieces of paper with crystal substance hidden in his shoe. It was suspected methamphetamine.

IPD also charged the driver, William M. Floyd, 32, of Ginter Road, Ravenna with trafficking in a controlled

substance, first degree, first offense (complicity).

Floyd reportedly told police he had driven Cornett to several locations and was provided gas money on one occasion.

He was going to be provided more money after the stop at Price Less.

A sister and brother were each charged with trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense, on Saturday night.

Citations state that a confidential informant working for the Irvine Police Depart-

ment arranged to meet John D. Hatfield, 37, and Traci Cahal, 45, both of Court Street, Irvine in an attempt to purchase heroin.

Sgt. Sturniolo says Cahal drove to the car wash on Winchester Road where a traffic stop was made.

Fritz, the K-9, alerted on her vehicle.

During a search of the vehicle, Sturniolo said a soda can with a false top was located in the console of the car. Inside it were five packets of suspected heroin wrapped in yellow paper.

Hepatitis A Outbreak continues in Kentucky

D'Alessio reports that of the 11 people in Hardin County with the disease, none have been identified as restaurant workers. To date, a food transmitter has not been identified in any Kentucky outbreaks.

Most of the state's cases so far have been among the state's homeless and drug users, says the DPH website.

Louisville's health department also posted a tweet that says an employee of Texas Roadhouse at 13321 Shelbyville Road had been diagnosed with hepatitis A and that anyone who ate there between April 11 and April 25 should monitor for symptoms through June 14 as they may have been exposed to the virus.

On May 8, WSAZ-TV reported that an employee who handled food at the Dairy Queen on 13th Street in Ashland was diagnosed with hepatitis A.

"The investigation found that the risk of restaurant patrons becoming infected is very low," health officials stated in a press release. "Dairy Queen is working with the health department to prevent any new cases from arising in the community as a result of this case."

"This makes the fifth food worker in Boyd County diagnosed with the disease this year during this multistate outbreak," reports the station in Huntington, W.Va.

The CDC notes that hepatitis A is very hard to kill, and can live outside the body. It recommends hand washing with soap and water after using the bathroom or changing diapers, and before preparing or eating food, are the best ways to prevent an infection. A vaccine for the disease is also available.

The state health department has recommended hepatitis A vaccination for everyone in Jefferson, Bullitt, Hardin, Greenup, Carter and Boyd counties.

3 waive indictments on Rocket Docket

Three waived indictments on felony charges on the Estill Rocket Docket on May 17.

Eric Raider, 27, of Glory Street, Irvine waived an indictment for possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense.

According to the waiver, Newman had meth in his possession on May 6.

Marcum Johnson, 28, of Cantrill Street, Irvine, waived an indictment for second degree escape, while in police custody.

Johnson left on foot after escaping from a cruiser at the detention center on June 22, 2017.

Irvine Police Activity Report

A South Irvine man was arrested on three charges May 21 by Irvine Officer Colton Lewis.

The officer said he was dispatched to Park Avenue to investigate two males participating in a drug transaction.

He made contact with Kavan Richardson, 24, of South Irvine Road. The officer said he noticed a buck knife concealed under Richardson's brown hoodie.

According to the citation, Richardson became aggressive and began shouting when he was asked about the knife.

Officer Lewis charged Richardson with disorderly conduct, second degree, carrying a concealed weapon, and resisting arrest.

On Sunday, Officer Brian Cloyd arrested Jennifer Anne Lindblom, 45, of Bertha Wallace Drive at her residence.

The citation states the officer was sent to her residence because she had fallen down in front of it.

He said he found the woman sitting in a puddle of water in front of the residence. She had slurred speech and an odor of alcohol.

He added that she began screaming which creating a public disturbance. She refused medical treatment.

IPD charged Lindblom with alcohol intoxication in a public place and disorderly conduct, second degree.

Officer Lewis said he received a call that an intoxicated female was walking in the middle of River Drive, May 23.

He said he found Jaquelyn Marie Neal, 30 of Collins Avenue, Irvine in the road. She was unsteady on her feet and smelled of alcoholic beverages.

He charged her with alcohol intoxication in a public place. After being placed under arrest, he was taken to the court house parking lot where she was being transferred to Three Forks Regional Jail.

The officer said she started cursing him. Neal was then charged with disorderly conduct, second degree.

Irvine Chief Brad Smith served a bench warrant on Vanessa Jones, 40, of Church

Street, Irvine on Sunday.

Judge Wm. Leach issued the warrant saying Jones had failed to appear in Estill District Court on a charge of drug paraphernalia - buy/possess. She was to be held without bail.

Curtis Baskin, 35, of Winchester was arrested by Irvine Police on Saturday on a bench warrant from Estill District Court.

Baskin reportedly failed to pay a fine. He was found guilty in 2015 of careless driving. Charles of operating on a suspended or revoked license, failure to surrender revoked operator license, and display or possession of cancelled or fictitious license were revoked.

Zackary Schooler, 25, of Phyllis Ann Court, Irvine, was arrested on a bench warrant by IPD, May 21.

Judge Leach issued the warrant saying Schooler failed to appear in Estill District Court for review after being found guilty of assault fourth degree.

Schooler was found guilty of the charge in March of 2016.

No bail was set.

An indictment warrant was served May 20 on Jeremiah Hix by IPD.

Hix was indicted in Estill Circuit Court on charges of trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree, second or greater offense and being a persistent felony offender.
