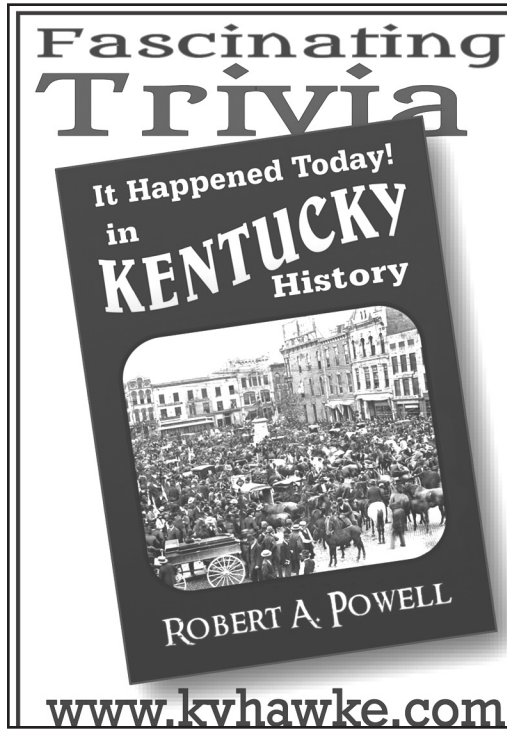
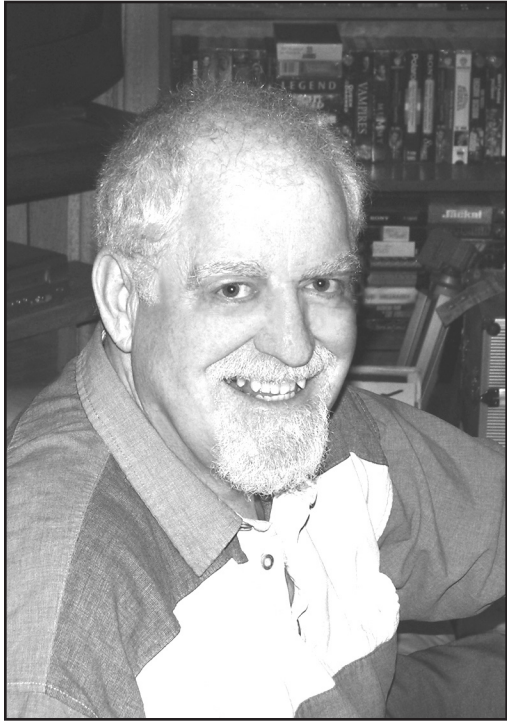


Presentation on Kentucky's Colorful Heritage!

Robert A. Powell is 2015 Recipient of the "Jesse Stuart Award"



Noted Kentucky artist and author, Robert A. Powell, the 2015 Recipient of the "Jesse Stuart Award" from the Kentucky Association of School Librarians, will offer a presentation "It Happened In Kentucky" at the Estill County Historic Society Museum on Friday, May 11 at 6 p.m. This event is free and open to the public.

Powell will exhibit a portfolio of his pen & ink drawings of central Kentucky landmarks along with a display of books he has written about Kentucky subjects. His books will be available to peruse or purchase, and he will be available following the presentation to meet and talk with the public and

The distinctive art and writing of Robert A. Powell have long been acclaimed as a dynamic force in capturing and depicting vibrant images of history and heritage. His track record includes 39 published books, most on Kentucky subjects.

A native Kentuckian Robert A. Powell grew up in the Appalachian foothills and the Bluegrass country around Lexington. After graduating from Bryan Station High School in Lexington, he earned his BA degree at Kentucky Wesleyan College with majors in English and art and pursued graduate studies in communications and journalism at the University of Kentucky and Western Kentucky University.

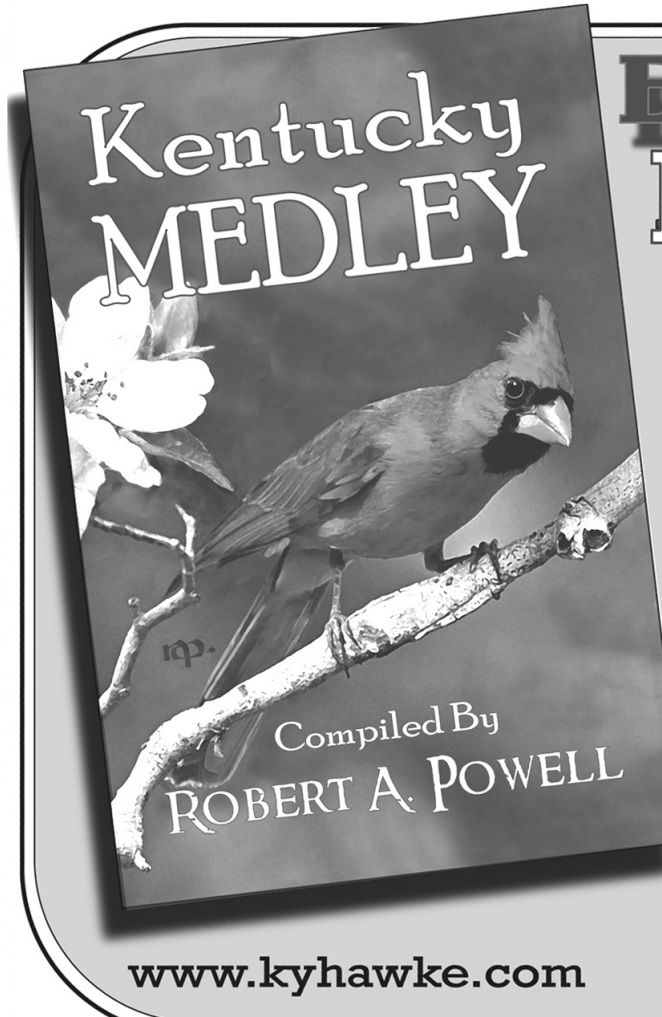
Powell worked as a reporter and photographer for the Clay City Times, Lexington Herald-Leader, and Owensboro Messenger-Inquirer. He taught journalism, art, and English at high schools in both Kentucky and Florida, and served as a public relations specialist for the Kentucky Department of Education, the U. S. Office of Education, and Appalachian Regional Hos-

pitals.

He served as Executive Editor of Kentucky Images Magazine for six years and was Editor of the Oleikan magazine for Oleika Shrine in Lexington, Kentucky for ten years and for Na Khabar magazine of the Oriental Bands Association of North America for five years.

Nineteen of his books are still active on Amazon and various bookstores, while several of his out-of-print titles are considered collector items. His newest release in Kentucky Medley, a concise notebook of Kentucky's heritage profusely illustrated with his unique pen & ink drawings, pencil drawings, and photographs. It has been declared by some as his best work yet. He was proclaimed by the Lexington Herald-Leader as "quite likely the most influential popular chronicler of Kentucky in recent years." The pen & ink style of Robert A. Powell has made him a favorite at interpreting subjects of Kentucky's fascinating history for more than fifty years.

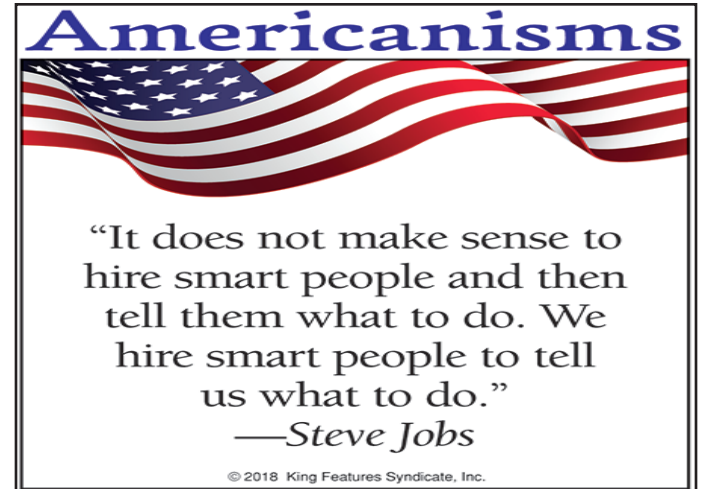
The 120 Kentucky counties are listed in the order they were created, with date and origin of name.

INSPECTION PERIOD FOR THE PROPERTY TAX ASSESSMENT ROLL

The **Estill County** real property tax roll will be opened for inspection from **May 7 through May 21, 2018**. Under the supervision of the property valuation administrator or one of the deputies, any person may inspect the tax roll.

This is the **January 1, 2018** assessment on which state, county and school taxes for **2018** will be due about **September 15, 2018**.

The tax roll is in the office of the property valuation administrator in the county courthouse and may be inspected between the hours **Mon-Fri 8:00 to 4:00 and Sat. 8:00 to 12:00**

Any taxpayer desiring to appeal an assessment on real property made by the PVA must first request a conference with the PVA or a designated deputy. The conference may be held prior to or during the inspection period.

Any taxpayer still aggrieved by an assessment on real property, after the conference with the PVA or designated deputy, may appeal to the county board of assessment appeals.

The taxpayer can appeal his assessment by filing in person or sending a letter or other written petition stating the reasons for appeal, identifying the property and stating the taxpayer's opinion of the fair cash value of the property.


The appeal must be filed with the county clerk's office no later than one work day following the conclusion of the inspection period.

A taxpayer failing to appeal to the county board of assessment appeals, or failing to appear before the board, either in person or by designated representative, will not be eligible to appeal directly to the Kentucky Claims Commission.

Appeals of personal property assessments shall not be made to the county board of assessment appeals. Personal property taxpayers shall be served notice under the provisions of KRS 132.450(4) and shall have the protest and appeal rights granted under the provision of KRS 131.110.

The following steps should be taken when a taxpayer does not agree with the assessed value of personal property as determined by the property valuation administrator.

- (1) He must list under protest (for certification) what he believes to be the fair cash value of his property.
- (2) He must file a written protest directly with the Department of Revenue, Office of Property Valuation within 30 days from the date of the notice of assessment.
- (3) This protest must be in accordance with KRS 131.110.
- (4) The final decision of the Department of Revenue may be appealed to the Kentucky Claims Commission.
