James P. Tipton, 50, of James St., Irvine was named in an eight count indictment.

The indictment charges Tipton on April 5 with driving on a DUI suspended license, second offense, operating a motor vehicle failed to report correct household circumunder the influence alcohol/drugs, trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree of \$32,891.00. and first offense (four percocets), trafficking in a controlled substance, second degree and first offense (two suboxones), possession of marijuana, trafficking in a controlled substance, third degree and first offense (4 xanax and 16 gabapentin), carrying a concealed deadly weapon, and failure of nonowner to maintain required insurance, first
