

Arrest made in assault to Barnes Mt. pedestrian

An Estill Countian is charged with assault after a man was injured with a knife on Barnes Mountain on May 1.

The victim, Joshua Collins, told Deputy Russell "Doc" Morris that he and his brother were walking down Barnes Mountain Road when he was assaulted.

He told the deputy that Willam McKinney, 40, of Bobby Miller Road, Irvine stopped in the roadway and started arguing with them. He added that McKinney then swung a knife at him and injured his right arm.

Deputy Morris charged McKinney with assault second degree.

McKinney was lodged in Three Forks Regional Jail.

He was arraigned in front of a trial commissioner on Monday.

A preliminary hearing will be held within 10 days for McKinney unless he waives it.

"It's just a win-win for everybody," he stated.

For the last 30 years, Harvev has been fire chief of the Ravenna Fire Department, where he's been responsible for the training of 32 volunteer fire fighters.
