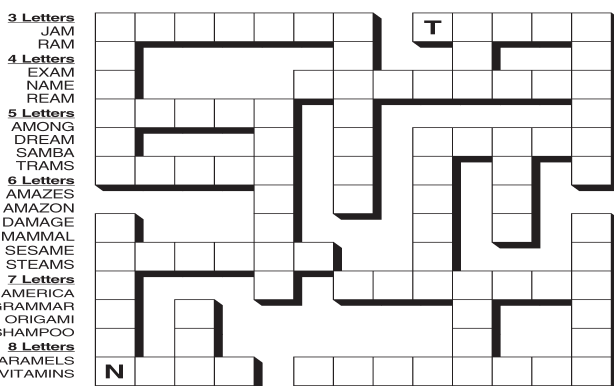

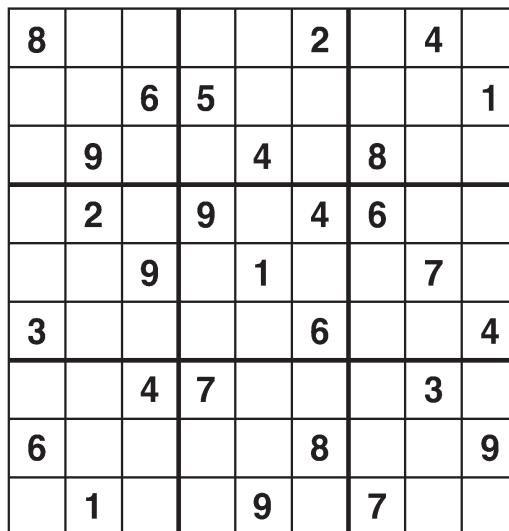
CRISSCROSS — "AM" WORDS

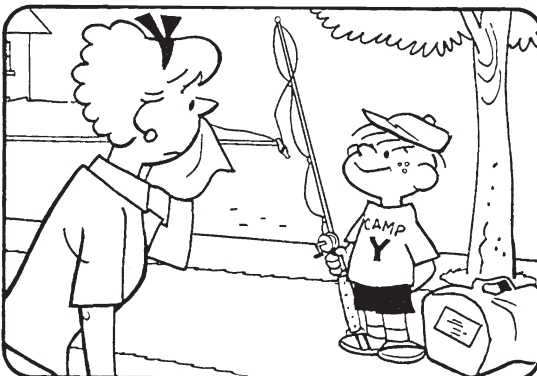
