

Irvine Police continue "War on Drugs"

She was charged with two counts of trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense (methamphetamine and opiates), first degree wanton endangerment, tampering with physical evidence, possession of marijuana, and drug paraphernalia - buy/possess.

Turpin was arraigned Monday in Estill District Court. She pled not-guilty. Her preliminary hearing is set for June 6.

A driver and two passengers were arrested May 29 by the Irvine Police Department.

A confidential informant coordinated a drug transaction to occur at the car wash on Winchester Road. The three were traveling in a gray Dodge Durango.

Sgt. Sturniolo said that one of the passen-

gers, Michael Lee Adams, 19, of N. Plum Street, Irvine got out of the vehicle when he saw IPD units pulling into the car wash. He was located at Wall Street and Winchester Road by Officer Colton Lewis.

The citation states that a traffic stop was conducted on the vehicle on the Bypass by Sturniolo. Irvine's K-9, Fritz, alerted on the vehicle.

Sturniolo said police found multiple needles, scales, and methamphetamine inside the vehicle. One needle was loaded with suspected methamphetamine.

Methamphetamine, heroin, and gabapentin pills were reportedly found hidden in the center console of the vehicle.

Officer Lewis charged Adams with trafficking in a controlled substance, first of-

fense (heroin), trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense (methamphetamine), trafficking in a controlled substance, third degree, first offense, drug paraphernalia - buy/possess, and possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense (methamphetamine).

The driver of the vehicle was Jeffrey Hardy, 57, of Picnic Hill Road, Irvine. IPD charged him with two counts of trafficking in a controlled substance, first (heroin and methamphetamine), trafficking in a controlled substance, third degree, failure of owner to maintain insurance, drug paraphernalia, and possession of a controlled substance, first degree (methamphetamine).

The other passenger was identified as Charles Hamilton, 40, of John Rawlins

Road, Irvine.

During a search, IPD reports they found a baggie of methamphetamine in the pocket of Hamilton's shorts.

Hamilton was charged with two counts of trafficking in a controlled substance, first (heroin and methamphetamine), trafficking in a controlled substance, third degree, drug paraphernalia, and possession of a controlled substance, first degree (methamphetamine).

Adams was arraigned May 30 in Estill District Court. He pleaded not-guilty to his charges.

His bond was set at \$10,000 cash and a preliminary hearing was set for June 6.

Hamilton's bond is \$15,000 cash. Hardy's is \$7,500 cash. Information on their court dates was unavailable.

Man charged with felony for leaving scene of collision

State trooper T. Allen arrested a man following a two car collision on Noland Creek Road on May 28.

Witnesses told the trooper the driver of a 1997 Nissan fled the scene on foot.

A neighbor told the state policeman he heard the crash and went outside to give aid. He added the driver went into his residence without permission. A "No Trespassing" sign is posted on the property.

The citation states the man being sought took off his short pants and left them behind a building and fled on foot.

According to the citation, a syringe was located in the center console and an empty, open container of KY Gentlemen alcohol was found in the Nissan.

Trooper Allen stated he

located William C. Tuttle, 33, on nearby Warner Lane.

He charged Tuttle, who gave an address of New Fox Road, Irvine, with leaving the scene of an accident - failure to render aid or assistance, criminal mischief second degree, possession of open alcoholic beverage container, drug paraphernalia - buy/possess, license to be in possession, fleeing or evading police, first degree (on foot), operating a motor vehicle under the influence, and failure of owner to maintain required insurance.

The driver of the other vehicle reportedly asked Tuttle for help and told him his wife was hurt. The man and his wife both had injuries from the collision.

Tuttle's bail was set at \$1,000 cash.

IPD Activity Report

Tamera N. McQueen, 31, of Tipton Ridge Road, Ravenna was charged with operating a motor vehicle under the influence on River Drive and careless operation on May 30 by the Irvine Police Department.

The citation states that dispatch received calls referring to a white Pontiac Grand AM that was all over the roadway. Driver reportedly told the officers that she had taken suboxone and smoked marijuana.

A parole violation warrant was served on Elizabeth Sandlin by the Irvine Police Department on May 30.

According to the warrant, Sandlin was paroled on May 15. It adds that she has absconded parole supervision and failed to report to a parole officer.

She had been convicted in Madison Circuit Court on two counts of possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense and promoting contraband, first degree.

A traffic stop for only one headlight resulted in a driver and passenger being arrested May 30 by the Irvine Police Department on Main Street.

Michael D. Bishop, 33, of Rice Station Road, Irvine was charged with possession of a controlled substance,

first degree and first offense, drug paraphernalia - buy/possess, and one headlight.

Officers Colton Lewis and Jason Conrad report finding an empty needle and a scale. The citation states that on the scale was a clear crystal substance, which tested positive for methamphetamine.

The passenger, Katasha Sasha Coffey, 25, of Wisemantown Road, Irvine was charged with possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense (methamphetamine), and drug paraphernalia - buy/possess.

Two active bench warrants from Madison Circuit Court were served on Coffey. Both warrants said that Coffey had violated her probation on a felony offense. She was to be held without bail.

A Lee Circuit Court warrant was served June 2 by Officer Jason Conrad on Brian K. Johnson, 37, of Beattyville.

Judge Michael Dean issued the warrant saying that Johnson failed to appear on May 18 in reference to a charge of fraudulent insurance acts, over \$500.

Irvine Police, with the assistance of KSP Trooper John Northern, arrested a woman on Hall-Abney Cemetery Road on June 3.

The citation states that

police had gone to the residence of Trina L. Goosey, 41, to serve an arrest warrant on her.

She had just gotten out of the shower, and officers say they let her put clothes on behind closed doors.

They add that was when Goosey went through a window and fled into a creek and wooded area.

The officers said they located her hiding in the creek.

She was charged with fleeing or evading police, second degree (on foot).

The arrest warrant had been obtained by Irvine Chief Brad Smith and charged Goosey with possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense (heroin), public intoxication of a controlled substance, and drug paraphernalia - buy/possess.

The warrant states that on May 23, Goosey was under the influence of a controlled substance and was passed out in the bathroom of Steam Engine Pizza Pub.

Smith, along with Estill County EMS, made contact with Goosey. Police located a loaded needle, a portion of a tin can with residue and an arm band.

The citation states that she refused treatment and was released to her family to be transported to Marcum & Wallace Hospital for treatment. The police chief checked with the hospital and he says Goosey never arrived there for treatment.

Goosey pled not-guilty to the charges during her arraignment in Estill District Court on June 4. She will return to district court for a preliminary hearing on June 6.

The Garden Bug

Making stems root

- 1) Make a shallow cut to a stem a few inches from main branch. Apply rooting powder to the exposed area.
- 2) Wrap with moist sphagnum moss. Enclose the moss securely with plastic. Allow 10-12 weeks for rooting, keeping it moist throughout.
- 3) Remove the rooted stem and plant in a container.
