— On June 15th, 2018, participants will join together at the annual Relay For Life of Estill County at the Estill County High School track to help the American Cancer Society attack cancer from every angle. The event will start at 6:00 PM and end at 12 AM. The American Cancer Society is the cause fighting cancer on every front; standing shoulder to shoulder with cancer patients and those supporting them. Funds raised help the ACS attack cancer in dozens of ways, each of them critical to achieving a world without cancer. The question we are often

asked is "where does my donations go?" Your donation helps with many different things for the people of Estill County! In 2017, your funds helped provided Estill County residents with 68 unique services. • Six patients and four caregivers stayed a total of 60 nights at a Hope Lodge. A one-night stay at the Hope Lodge saves that patient and their caregiver \$144, so that is a cost savings of over \$4,600 for those patients and caregivers. • One patient was given a wig and other non-wig head coverings.

• One patient was supplied with a Personal Health Manager, which is an organizational binder for those going through treatment, specific to their type of cancer. • Three referrals were given to other resources to help patients through treatment through our Cancer Resource Connection which is a database of all national and local resources that a patient might be able to utilize or find helpful while going through treatment. The ACS has also invested over \$7 million dollars to fund research being conducted right here in Kentucky,

through Hosparus, Inc., the University of Kentucky and the University of Louisville. The work conducted through this research has allowed us to make major advancements including uncovering a key way to stop tumors from growing; pioneering work in bone marrow transplants; and gaining insight that inspired researchers to investigate and confirm that tamoxifen can both treat and sometimes prevent breast cancer.
