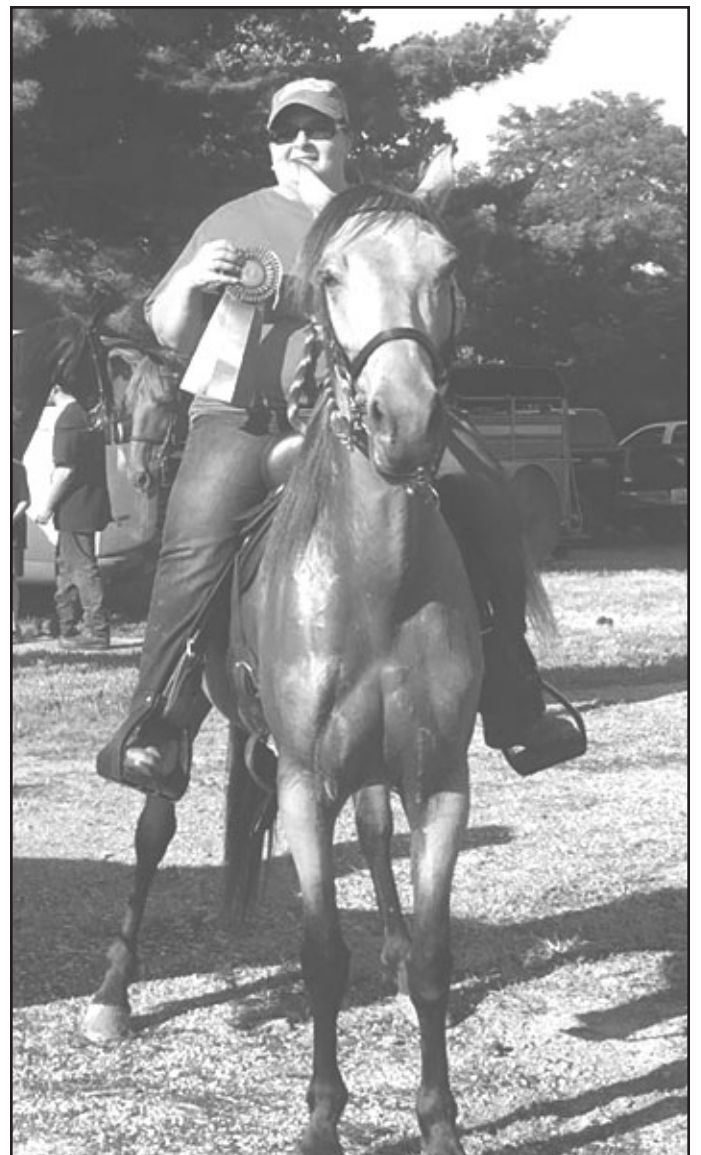

## Indictments waived by six who plea on Rocket Docket

Six persons facing felony charges recently waived their rights to be indicted by the Grand Jury and be sentenced via the Rocket Docket program.

**LaDonna Riddell**, aka LaDonna Newman, waived an indictment to possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense.

The waiver states that she had heroin in her possession on June 6.

She also waived an indictment for trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense and tampering with physical evidence.

That waiver states that on May 3, she had heroin in her possession with the intent to sell.

She entered guilty pleas June 21 in Estill Circuit Court and was sentenced by Judge Michael Dean.

**Elliott Muncy, 28**, of Iron Works Road, Irvine waived an indictment for possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense. He allegedly had methamphetamine in his possession on June 15.

Judge Dean is expected to issue an order in Muncy's case. The court stipulated that Muncy was serving a diverted sentence which had been violated.

**Edward Newton, 41**, of Richmond pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense on the Rocket Docket. It says he had methamphetamine in his possession on June 9.

Judge Dean entered a diversion order for Newton. He must show proof that he attends West Care.

**James B. McMillan, 27**, of Winchester, waived a charge of possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense.

The waiver says that McMillan had methamphetamine in his possession on June 7.

McMillan pled guilty and was sentenced to diversion. He must show proof of West Care attendance.

**Dakota Harvey, 23**, of Broadway, Irvine waived an indictment for possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense. She reportedly had methamphetamine in her possession on June 6.

Harvey pled guilty and was sentenced to diversion.

An indictment was waived for **Tisha D. Burchett, 46**, of Millers Creek Road, Ravenna on a single charge of cultivating marijuana (5 plants or more).

She pled guilty and was sentenced to diversion. She must show proof of West Care attendance.

**Wesley Edmonson, 41**, of Red Lick Road, Irvine waived an indictment for trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense and tampering with physical evidence.

The indictment says that on March 9, Edmonson had methamphetamine in his possession with the intent to sell. It adds that he tried to conceal a plastic baggie with meth.

Edmonson entered guilty pleas and was sentenced.

Four pled guilty on the Rocket Docket on June 7 and were sentenced.

**Trina Goosey** pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense. The waiver says she had heroin in her possession on May 23.

**William Cornett** pled guilty to trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense.

He reportedly had less than two grams of meth in his possession on May 23 with the intent to sell.

**Jeff Hardy** entered guilty pleas to two counts of trafficking in a controlled substance, first offense.

The waiver states that he had less than two grams of heroin and meth in his possession on May 29 with the intent to sell.

**Charles Hamilton** entered guilty pleas to two counts of trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense, and being a first degree persistent felony offender.

The waiver states that he had less than two grams of each heroin and meth on May 29 with the intent to sell.

It also states that he has been previously convicted of at least two prior felony offenses.

An Irvine woman was arrested last Wednesday on an outstanding warrant by Irvine Police Chief Brad Smith and Sgt. John Sturniolo.

The chief says the officers went to the residence of **Patricia "Patty" Meacacke, 53**, on North Plum Street to serve the warrant. They found her hiding behind the residence.

Chief Smith adds that Meacacke resisted arrest while being handcuffed and refused the officers' commands. While walking up the street, Smith stated that Meacacke yelled, screamed, and cursed. Then, she was combative with jail staff.

Smith charged Meacacke with resisting arrest and second degree disorderly conduct.

The police chief also charged Meacacke with three charges in connection with incidents earlier this month.

Smith said on June 6, he went to Family Dollar on Richmond Road where he viewed video footage of Meacacke using a lost credit card.

The owner of the card reported he had dropped his wallet accidentally while leaving the Dollar Store.

After her arrest, Smith said that Meacacke stated she had found the card and decided to use it.

The citation states she first used the card on June 4 for a \$153.00 purchase. Another attempt to use the card for \$66.00 was denied.

Meacacke was charged with theft - receipt of a stolen credit/debit card, theft by deception under \$500 and attempted theft by deception under \$500.

The bench warrant was issued by Circuit Judge Michael Dean. He says Meacacke has failed to pay \$195.00 after being placed on diversion for first degree criminal mischief and fourth degree assault on Oct. 10, 2017.

Judge Dean set Meacacke's bail at \$195.00 cash. She was lodged in the Three Forks Regional Jail.

**Wanda D. Watson, 46**, of Dry Branch Road, Irvine was arrested June 21 by Irvine Officer Colton Lewis on charges of alcohol intoxication and giving officer false identifying information.

The officer was called to the boat ramp under the Irvine bridge to investigate a male and female passed out in a vehicle.

The citation states the woman had a broken methamphetamine pipe in her

purse. She gave a social security number that did not match her name.

A bench warrant on Watson was active from Estill District Court.

District Judge William Leach says that Watson failed to appear on a charge of failure to register transfer of a vehicle. He ordered her to be held without bail.

On June 22, Officer Lewis arrested **Ladonna Susan Riddell, 37**, on a Fayette County warrant for possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense.

Detective R.J. Sinnott of Lexington Police Department says he encountered Riddell on April 12 at a Target store. She was arrested on a misdemeanor shoplifting charge. During a search prior to arrest, Officer C. Wade located approximately 5.3 grams of suspected heroin in two baggies in her purse.

The narcotics were seized and submitted to the KSP lab for testing. The lab found the total weight of the narcotics to be approximately 3.819 grams of heroin and fentanyl.

The detective has been unable to reach Riddell, and she has been charged with narcotics related charges in Estill County on May 3 and June 6.

Two Estill County warrants were served June 22 on **Travis Cooper, 21**, of Greenville, Ky by Officer Lewis.

District Judge Leach issued a warrant saying that Cooper has failed to pay \$693.00 plus a \$35.00 service fee. Cooper was found guilty on Oct. 11, 2017 of leaving the scene of an accident - failure to render aid.

Judge Leach set Cooper's bail at \$728.00 cash.

Cooper was sentenced to diversion in Estill Circuit Court on April 28, 2017 on a charge of theft by unlawful taking or disposition over \$500 but under \$10,000.

Circuit Judge Dean says that Cooper has failed to appear, because he left a court ordered rehab.

Judge Dean has ordered that Cooper be held without bail.

**Ashley Hall, 28**, of Turner Ave., Irvine was arrested June 19 by Officer Lewis on a warrant obtained by Chief Smith, charging her with criminal trespass, second degree.

The chief says on May 13, Hall used force on a locking mechanism on the exterior door of Renaissance Apts. to gain entry.

**Vanessa Jones, 40**, of Sandhill Road, Irvine, was charged June 20 with public intoxication.

Officer Lewis said he was dispatched to Evergreen and Armour Street where Jones was digging up rocks beside the road.

**Trevor McKinney, 26**, of South Irvine was arrested at Marcum & Wallace Hospital on June 21.

Officer Lewis charged McKinney with public intoxication, second degree disorderly conduct, and resisting arrest.

The officer said he was dispatched to Wisemantown Road to investigate a male who was acting crazy and going from door to door.

McKinney was treated and released from the hospital, but Officer Lewis said he refused to leave.

He said McKinney continued yelling random numbers and disobeyed commands.

**April K. Goosey, 39**, of Pea Ridge Road, Irvine was arrested on a warrant, June 18 by Trooper C. Caudill.

The warrant charged Goosey with flagrant non-support.

According to the warrant, Goosey was ordered in Estill Circuit Court in 2014 to pay child support. It states that she has never made a payment and is in arrears of \$5,662.00.

Bail for Goosey was set at

\$500.00 cash.

**Rodney Shane Hix, 41**, of Hix Lane, Irvine was arrested June 22 on North Minor Lane by Trooper C. Roark.

The citation states that Trooper Roark was assisting Trooper Caudill and Deputy Morris in an attempt to locate a male subject on Minor Lane.

He stated the officers observed Hix and several others on the street near a known drug house.

The citation states that Hix was the front seat passenger of a black Jeep. The doors were open, and the vehicle was parked at the drug house.

Trooper Roark said the subjects began to walk away when they saw police, and Deputy Morris noticed that Hix was acting fidgety.

The female driver reportedly gave permission for officers to search the vehicle.

The trooper said he located an uncapped syringe concealed beside the front passenger seat and center console. In the back seat, he located a cigarette pack with two folded pieces of paper inside. The trooper said the packets contained suspected heroin.

Hix was charged with possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense (heroin) and tampering with physical evidence.

Trooper Caudill said he made contact with the next door neighbor, Stacy Lynn McGee, 33, of 106 S. Court Street, #1. She reportedly told officers that no one was inside her apartment, and she had not seen Douglas Edward "Eddie" Sizemore, 35, the man police was looking for.

The trooper said that McGee gave officers permission to search her residence and they found Sizemore hiding in the back bedroom.

McGee was charged with hindering prosecution or apprehension in the second degree by Irvine Officer Colton Lewis.

Trooper Caudill stated that Sizemore was told to get on the ground, but took an aggressive stance toward him.

The citation states that Sizemore admitted to taking a Playstation from a White

Oak residence. It adds that he returned stolen property to the officers, which included the Playstation, several games, and two controllers.

Sizemore was charged with receiving stolen property under \$10,000, fleeing or evading police, second degree (on foot), menacing, and resisting arrest.

An unidentified witness told law enforcement that she had seen Sizemore and his girlfriend, Megan Cox, bring the stolen stuff into their apartment.

An address of 102 S. Court Street, Apt. 8 was also listed for Cox, 21. She was charged with receiving stolen property under \$10,000.

Sizemore and Cox were in Estill District Court on June 20 and 27.

Cox's bail was set at 10% of a \$1,000 cash bond. Sizemore's bail was set at \$7,500 cash.
