Lyle Jeffery Elliott, 61

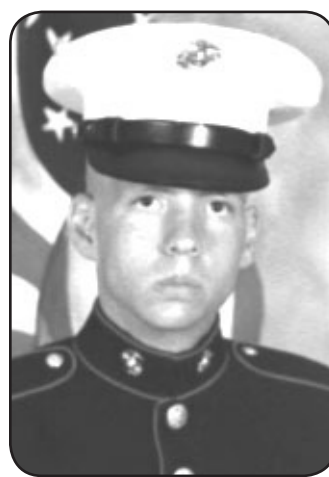
