

# Grand Jury returns many indictments

The indictment also charges him with 31 counts of possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. Those firearms included rifles and shotguns.

It further charges Harrison with menacing, resisting arrest, disorderly conduct, and criminal mischief third degree.

The indictment states that Harrison placed KSP Trooper Brandon Roark and IPD Officer Brian Cloyd in danger of imminent physical injury and tried to prevent his arrest.

It says he caused a public annoyance and damaged Officer Cloyd's name plate.

**Brian Lee Brewer, 40**, of Clay City was named in a 17 count indictment as the result of a traffic stop by IPD Officer Colton Lewis on May 18.

Traffic offenses on the indictment include no/expired registration plates, failure to maintain insurance, leaving the scene of an accident, and no tail lamps.

Brewer was charged with two counts of trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree (heroin and 4.3 grams of methamphetamine). He was also charged with trafficking in marijuana, less than eight

ounces.

He was also indicted for possession of a controlled substance, first degree (hydrocodone) and third degree (klonopin) and drug paraphernalia - buy/possess (digital scale and glass pipe).

The indictment charged him with criminal possession of a forged instrument, first degree. It states he had 67 counterfeit \$100 bills in his possession.

He was charged with fleeing or evading police, first degree (motor vehicle) and second degree (by foot).

Brewer was indicted for menacing, resisting arrest, wanton endangerment first degree of a police officer, and carrying a concealed deadly weapon.

Two indictments were returned against **Joseph Lee Ledford, 40**, of Cantrill Street, Irvine.

The first indictment charges Ledford with one count of distribution of matter portraying sexual performance by a minor, first offense and 20 counts of possession of matter portraying sexual performance by a minor on February 15.

The investigation was conducted by Detectives Anthony Gatson and Leslie Strong of KSP Electronic

Crimes Division.

The second indictment charges Ledford with drug paraphernalia - buy/possess (pipe) and possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense (methamphetamine) on April 12.

KSP Trooper Ty Robinson conducted that investigation.

An indictment for murder was returned against **Edward Daniel Tipton Jr., 29**, of Pryse Road, Irvine.

Tipton has been in Three Forks Regional Jail since his brother Travis Tipton died on April 24.

KSP Det. Austin Brashear investigated.

**Lindon W. Pelfrey, 51**, of Stanton was indicted for possession of a controlled substance, first degree (methamphetamine) and second degree (2 suboxone strips) and public intoxication on June 5.

**Ryan Newton, 30**, of Riddell Clem Road, Irvine, was indicted for possession of a controlled substance, first degree (methamphetamine), trafficking in a controlled substance, second degree (four suboxone pills), and drug paraphernalia - buy/possess (glass pipe, metal spoon, and small baggies).

He was also charged by indictment with being a first degree persistent felony offender, having been convicted previously of two prior felonies.

**Marsha Maggard, 34**, of Traylor Road, Irvine was indicted for theft of a legend drug, first offense and drug paraphernalia - buy/possess.

According to the indictment, she took a bottle of Lidocaine from a trauma room at Marcum & Wallace Hospital on Sept. 25, 2014. She was also charged with drug paraphernalia - buy/possess (two syringes).

IPD Sgt. Sturniolo conducted the investigation.

**Eric D. Cox, 41**, of Edgewater Irvine was indicted for possession of a controlled substance, first degree (methamphetamine)

and drug paraphernalia - buy possess (glass pipes, rolling papers and syringes).

Sgt. Sturniolo investigated the case on May 11.

**Roy Edward McIntosh, 44**, of Beattyville was indicted for tampering with physical evidence. The indictment says on May 10, he altered a drug test.

He was also charged with second degree persistent felony offender having been convicted of one previous felony.

Megan Perkins of Probation and Parole investigated the case.

**Glenn R. Cockrell, 38**, of Walling Road, Irvine was indicted for burglary second degree, criminal mischief third degree, and first degree persistent felony offender.

According to the indictment, he entered an outbuilding owned by Wilton Flynn on December 25 and broke a security light.

Trooper John Northern conducted the investigation.

**Andy Estes, 42**, of Eli Sparks Road, Irvine, was indicted for prohibited use of electronic communications system to procure a minor. The indictment says a peace officer posed as a 13 year old female for nude images over an electronic device on Feb. 28.

Det. Strong investigated this case.

**Justin Gerber, 41**, of Covey Road, Irvine was named in a seven count indictment as the result of a traffic stop by Trooper Ty Robinson on May 15.

Gerber was indicted for operating a motor vehicle under the influence, fourth or greater offense; driving DUI suspended license, second offense; failure to wear seat belt, possession of open alcohol beverage container in vehicle; no/expired Ky. registration receipt, failure to produce insurance card, and first degree persistent felony offender.

**Jessiva Taylor Doan, 21**, of Sandhill Road, Irvine was

indicted for possession of marijuana, possession of a controlled substance, second degree (suboxone) and trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense (methamphetamine) on April 20.

KSP Trooper Carl Roark investigated the case.

**Lorene N. Young, 59**, of Front Street, Irvine was indicted for drug paraphernalia - buy/possess (baggies and scale) and trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree, second or greater offense (methamphetamine) on Feb. 18.

Trooper Casey Caudill was the investigating officer. A six count indictment was returned against **Bertha Lynn Jones, 47**, of Scott Court, Irvine.

She was charged with second degree forgery, two counts of theft by deception - include cold checks, theft - receipt of stolen credit/debit card, second degree burglary, and theft by unlawful taking.

The indictment says on January 29, she entered the residence of Lola Young and took a purse and cash. She allegedly cashed one of Young's checks for \$32.79 and used her ATM card to obtain \$27.57.

IPD Chief Brad Smith and KSP Trooper Derek Lovett conducted the investigation.

**Shawn C. Cornett, 25**, of Burton Williams Road, Irvine and **Ashley N. Plowman, 22**, of Mountain Crest, Irvine were named as co-defendants in an indictment.

The indictment charges them with possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense, and possession of marijuana.

KSP Trooper Adam Hall conducted the investigation on June 10, 2016.

**Katasha Sasha Coffey, 25**, of Wisemantown Road, Irvine and **Michael D. Bishop, 44**, of Rice Station Road, Irvine were named as co-defendants in an indictment.

They were each charged with possession of a controlled substance, first degree, first offense.

The indictment says Coffey had a syringe containing meth in her purse on May 30 and meth was located in Bishop's vehicle.

Both were charged with drug paraphernalia - buy/possess (scale and syringe).

Officer Lewis had charged Bishop with one headlight during a traffic stop.

**James E. Flynn, 55**, of Wagersville Road, Irvine was indicted for cultivation of marijuana (five plants or more) on May 29.

Det. Robert Walker of the Cannabis Suppression Unit appeared before the grand jury.

## Police News

**Steven D. Hoover, 48**, Oak Valley Road, Irvine was arrested June 29 by Sgt. John Sturniolo for possession of a controlled substance, second degree (suboxone) and possession of drug paraphernalia.

His citation states that he was scrapping metal from the construction site at Estill Springs Elementary and had an active warrant. He had a suboxone strip and a package of rolling papers on him.

The sergeant served the warrant on Hoover from Estill District Court. It says he failed to pay \$228 after being found guilty of fourth degree assault in 2016.

• Officer Colton Lewis served a bench warrant from Estill District Court on **Ryan C. Riddell, 23**, of Pea Ridge Road, Irvine on June 28

The bench warrant says Riddell failed to pay \$398 after being found guilty of drug paraphernalia in 2017.

It also adds that Bennett had an empty suboxone package. His prescription was for 10 pills on June 25.

The citation states that he admitting to taking 10 and did not follow the correct way to take the pills.

• Two bench warrants from Madison Circuit Court were served on **Gary D. Rogers, 51**, of Richmond by

Sgt. Sturniolo on June 27.

An indictment warrant charged Rogers with bail jumping, first degree.

The other warrant said he failed to appear May 10 n charges of possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense (methamphetamine) and theft by unlawful taking or disposition.

• Officer Lewis served two bench warrants from Garrard District Court on **Timothy W. Bartlett, 52**, of Cow Creek Road, Ravenna.

The warrants say that Bartlett was found guilty in 2016 of unauthorized use of a motor vehicle, first offense.

His bond was set at \$298 cash.

• A Madison District warrant was served on **Russell L. Brinegar, 25**, of Wallace Circle, Irvine on June 25 by Officer Lewis.

The warrant charges Brinegar with assault fourth degree (domestic violence).

It says that on June 17, Brinegar went to his cousin's house where his girlfriend was house sitting. They became involved in a verbal dispute and he punched her in the right side of the face.

The Richmond Police Department investigated the assault.

• **Ashley N. Wilfong, 32**, of Stanton was charged June 28 by Officer Colton Lewis with operating a motor vehicle under the influence, operating on a suspended or revoked license, rear license not illuminated, trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense (methamphetamine), and drug paraphernalia - buy/possess.

The officer confiscated \$288 in cash during the arrest.

She was scheduled to appear in court on July 2.

Shawn Riddell and Jonathan Marshall were hired as part-time firefighters. Second readings were given to the 2018-19 fiscal year budget, the county administrative code, and salary schedule.

After approving polices for 911 and CSEPP, the fiscal court opened its only bid it received for maintenance of the emergency sirens. The bid was for \$32,616 and was approved contingent upon approval by CSEPP.

Williams said the company will monitor 22 sirens, six alert sites, and two master control units.

In his opening remarks, he stated that road department was understaffed and overworked.

When FLEX money is received in July, the fiscal court will likely lease a tractor for roadside mowing. Williams said the county has 274 miles of roadsides to mow.
