The pencil cactus (also known as a "milk bush") is not really a cactus at all – it's a tropical plant native to Africa and India, though it needs very little water (probably the reason it's perceived as a cactus). It can grow as tall as 30 feet outside.

Wear gloves when working with this plant and thoroughly wash hands afterwards, as the toxicity of its milky sap is well-known. Contact can cause allergic reactions ranging from mild to evere enough to require hospitalization.
