"Dead, Yet Still Speaking"

In the Bible, both the Old Testament and the New, there is mentioned that many of the saints now long ago deceased are still speaking to us today. How can this be accomplished?

In Hebrews 11:4-5, here is mentioned Abel, the son of Adam and Eve, that by his accepted gift to God, even though being dead several thousand years, is still speaking to us today! In the next verse, here is said of Enoch that he walked with God and upon this walk one day, God said to Enoch, come home with me, you righteous man. He bypassed an earthly death because of his righteous lifestyle.

Also in Hebrews 11, there are many more named as well; Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, Moses; and many more mentioned throughout the Bible. How did these men speak while now dead? Simple, by their testimonial lives; by hearing, believing and obeying God, such as the great believer named Noah did.

And, in the New Testament, just look at all the faithful men and women who have left us with Godly examples; beginning with John the Baptizer, Jesus the Son of God, and all twelve Apostles, except Judas who left the world with a bad example. One said to the other, "I wonder how much he left behind?" His companion replied, "He left it all!" And such as it will be with all of us when our time on earth is over.

I had a nephew to sing a song at the funeral of my mother. It was entitled, "What will you leave behind?" It was a thought-provoking song.

Then, we can take this thought into a deeper self-examination of our lives as we are told to do in 2 Corinthians 13:5, to examine ourselves. No one knows yourself better than you and the Lord. If we were called to death even today, and let me remind myself and you as well, that is a possibility. So, if this suddenly happened to us, what would we leave behind that would help someone to acquire not great riches, but a home in Heaven. I would rather my children and grandchildren be Christians than to have the finest of houses, much land, large bank accounts, because one day we will shed all the earthly possessions we may gather and go to make our appearance before the Great White Throne of Judgment (See Revelations 20:11-15).

Remember those who left a legacy of obedience through their deeds and by them they gathered to themselves a good reward. Again, what will we leave behind?

Someone once said, "When all of life is over, done and passed; only what we have faithfully done in Jesus' name will last."

Visit with us as some have already done and have stayed. You can do the same. We hope that you will do it soon, Jesus is coming.

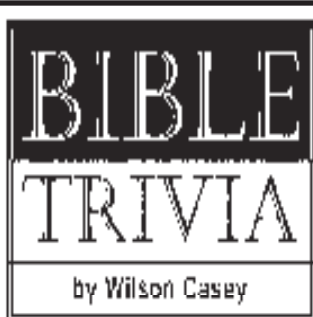
