Josephine McIntosh Roberts of Sandhill Road in Irvine was one of the first women to join the United States Marine Corps, enlisting in 1950 with a group of 50 women. Visiting with Mrs. Roberts last week at her home were Craig Pyles, commandant of Marine Corps League detachment 1012 in Richmond, and Patti Wahley who is assistant manager and does the group newsletter plus monthly posts on their Facebook page. Their motto is "Here to serve our fellow veterans of all services, their families and the community. Semper Fi." Despite the obvious difference in appearances of the two Marines, they bonded quickly, even finishing each other sentences as they talked about their similar experiences during Marine training and talking about the various commanding officers they served under.


Estill Co. Boys Golf Team Wins Another Tournament


