Auditing standards require the auditor's letter to communicate whether the financial statement presents fairly the receipts, disbursements and excess fees of the Estill County Clerk in accor- all weekly and monthly redance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. The clerk's financial reconciliations. According reconciliations for accuracy, statement did not follow this format.

However, the clerk's financial statement is fairly presented in conformity with the regulatory basis of accounting, which is an acceptable reporting methodology. This reporting methodology is followed for all 120 clerk audits in Kentucky.

If, due to a small staff size duties cannot be adequately segregated, the county clerk could implement and document compensating controls to reduce the risk of inadequate segregation of duties. Examples The county clerk prepares of compensating controls include: another employee comparing daily checkout sheet to receipts ledger and bank deposit, reviewing bank to the county clerk, due to a reviewing invoices prior to payment, and reviewing all financial reports. The employee could document the reporting, and reconciling review process by initialing funds are delegated to the reports and supporting documentation.

We recommend the county clerk segregate the duties of receiving, recording, depositing, disbursing, reporting, and reconciling funds set this control deficiency.
