Do we as a people like to be taken for granted? I don't remember if I ever met such a person. Being taken for granted is defined as one who is ignored, worthless, or not being considered with much value. The strong definition is "to take for granted is to think of anything as already proved or settled."

Sadly, most of this world's people seem to be living life as though their plan settles it for themselves, and so being, they leave the Lord out of their equation of God who has said in **Ecclesiastes 12:13-14**, "Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep his commandments: for this is the whole duty of man. <sup>14</sup>For God shall bring every work into judgment, with every secret thing, whether it be good, or whether it be evil."
