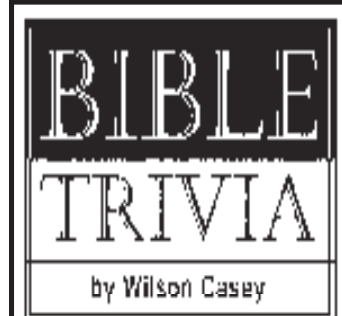

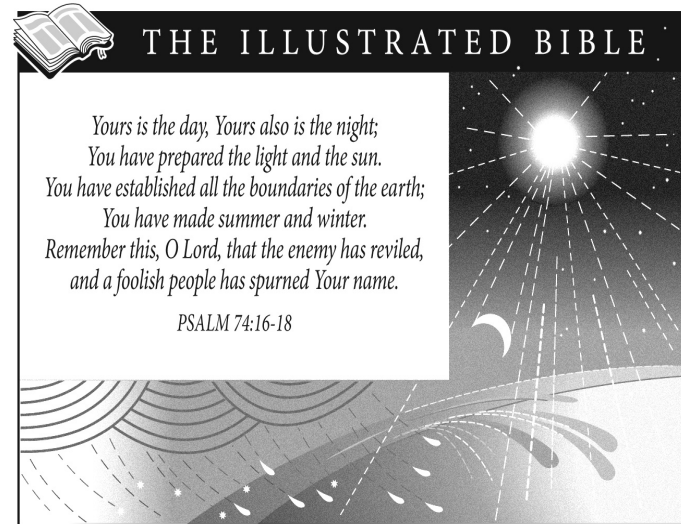
Mrs. McKinney was preceded in death by her husband, Kendall McKinney.
