In the **Book of Ecclesiastes 12, Verse 13**, Solomon, the wisest man who ever lived, besides our Lord Jesus, said, "Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep his commandments: for this is the whole duty of man."

Yet, with the admonition given to us, it seems from a perspective of simple observation that mankind seems to have forgotten this, to a great degree. We seem to have reached a point in history that people are no longer thirsting for righteousness as they once did. If this trend doesn't change its course, we are doomed to commit the mistakes of fallen man since the very beginning.

We have many examples of disregarding and disrespecting the will of God, beginning with Adam and Eve in the Garden; then we read about the people of Noah's day; then the people of Sodom and Gomorrah; and the Israelites who refused to follow the instructions of God to cross over Jordan and take the Promised Land; then the final rejection came from God when he let the armies of Rome finally annihilate them completely, destroying the political system and the religion they claimed to love so well. Yet, Josephus, the writer of the war of the worlds, said of Israel at that day, "never has there been a more disobedient and disrespectful nation of men who practice evil, as this generation."

to die and redeem us from our sins. Then, the Jews showed their hatred toward him by nailing him to his cross. Even today, there are those that claim to be religious that do not show the respect of our Lord even upon his day when they fail to go to the assemblies and worship as they once did.

Something is wrong! In Hebrews 10:25-29, herein is found a strong warning concerning our minds need worship, but yet men are forsaking it anyway. This is called sinning. Willfully knowing better; yet, many continue to turn a blind eye and a deaf ear to the love of God. Because of this, there is coming a day of vengeance upon a people of this way. Those who trample under foot the blood of Jesus will pay for it for sure.
