The Sins of the Flesh

In the **Book of Matthew, 19:3-6**, herein the Lord gives to us a great insight into his mind relative to the marriage bond. Being tempted by the Jews who sometimes had more than one wife, whom they treated oftentimes like merchandise, asked Jesus, *"Is it lawful for a man to put away (lose, get rid of) his wife for every cause?"* Our Lord's response was, *"Have ye not read, that he which made them at the beginning made them male and female, And said, For this cause shall a man leave father and mother, and shall cleave to his wife: and they twain shall be one flesh? Wherefore they are no more twain, but one flesh. What therefore God hath joined together, let not man put asunder."*

Then, they wanted to know, *"Why did Moses then command to give a writing of divorce, and to put her away?"* The answer, *"Moses because of the hardness of your hearts suffered you to put away your wives: but from the beginning it was not so."*

So then, to curb the mistreatment of wives this writing was given. Notice the commanding halt to this and the lone exception allowing a man to put away his wife was for fornication, defined by the Greek word, *"Porneia,"* meaning any act of illicit sexual intercourse. Also, the term *"adulterer"* denotes one who has unlawful intercourse with the wife of another, but the words are always used in the sense of someone breaking the Law of God concerning the permanence of marriage as God has said. And then, if a second marriage between two parties takes place when the divorce has not been for fornication, they become adulterers. (See John 8:1-11, 1 Corinthians 6:18, Hebrews 13:4).


Sadly, mankind has ventured very from from

the plan of God regarding marriage. Nearly 95% of the sinful action of fornication and adultery begin with Hollywood but now is seeming gone so far that many think that multiple marriages are simply a way of life. And then also, fornication has become so commonplace that many are moving in together without considering God's bond in marriage; even producing children that are illegitimate in God's sight.

Let me say this! God condemns all such sinful activities as being worthy of eternal death. Read Revelation 2:20-23, Matthew 5:32, and Mark 10:11-12, which show clearly that when God's law is broken, someone commits sin against God, whether it be a man or woman. **Galatians 5:19** says that the works of the flesh are many, but *"adultery" is always at the head of the list.* It also warns *"that they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God."* (Verse 21)

Another thing is, many times people will obey the Gospel who are living in an adulterous marriage, thinking that when God forgives, he also wipes away the sin of all illegal relationships. He will forgive any and all sin, but we must quit, sever, terminate all sinful activities to please God. In **Mark 6:17-18**, the Gentile ruler called Herod cast John the baptizer into prison because he said to this ruler, *"It is not lawful for thee to have thy brother's wife."* So then, God's law is to everyone, to the saved and the confessed Christian equally. So, if we are in an action, whether it be adultery or fornication, we must stop immediately to receive God's forgiveness. Our God is full of mercy, he will forgive even the sin of murder, but we must never do it again. So it is with the acts of fornication and adultery. Many will not do it for many reasons, but our God calls us to a decision when we choose to obey him. So with this being said, never believe anyone who may say that this preacher believes that there are other reasons for divorce other than fornication.

There once was a dog named "Nipper," a terrier who was very devoted to his master, Mark Barraud. The two were best friends and were rarely seen apart from each other. When Mark died, his brother Francis 'adopted' him and after a lengthy period of mourning, "Nipper" became very attached to Francis, an artist. Eventually they too developed a very close relationship. Mark and Francis lived in the latter 1800s and at that time phonographs with wax cylinders were used for recording voices and music. Some of Francis' cylinders contained recordings of his voice and each time he played one of his recordings "Nipper" would place his head near the phonograph and look intently into it as though he was looking for his new master to appear. "Nipper's" pose inspired the artist and he painted a picture of it that became one of the most famous and recognizable brands in all the world, called "His Master's Voice." In Psalm 99:7 we read that "He spoke to them from the pillar of cloud." What an unusual means of communication. Imagine walking through a field and suddenly hearing a cloud call you by name and give you a special message. Seems improbable but that's what God did to Moses and Aaron. And He can do that today. Our God is constantly speaking to us in different ways at different times and from different places. He will do everything He can to get our attention and share His message with us. If we want to hear our Master's voice, we must be open, attentive and waiting to hear Him speak.


