

# Engineers fall to Bell & finish 3<sup>rd</sup> in district

The Estill County Football Engineers hoped for a big upset over Bell County last Friday night in Irvine but came away a 55-12 loser and finished in 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the district behind Bell and Rockcastle counties.

The Engineers looked good in their opening drive with senior Justin Sparks getting some good yards rushing. Estill managed to stay close in the first half with their only touchdowns but Bell pulled away in the second half to take the win.

Stamper finished with 196 of Estill's total of 229 yards and the senior had one touchdown. Senior Ethan Webb received for 28 yards and a touchdown.

Stamper led in tackles with nine. Eli Haskell had 4 solo tackles and six total. Sophomore Jonothon Short also had six total with three solo tackles.

Bell County finishes the regular season 9-0 with a 5-0 slate in district for the first place seeding.

Rockcastle County won

over all except Bell County and finished in second with 6-3 and 4-1 records.

The Engineers are 5-4 with a 3-2 district slate.

McCreary County Central had not won a game all year but squeaked by Jackson County's Generals 21-20 to put the Generals in the bottom of the district, 2-7 and 0-5. MCC is now 1-8. Their only win last year was also against the Generals. They face Lynn Camp on Friday night.

Estill's seniors will likely be playing their last home game on Friday night against 1A Bethlehem from Bardstown. They are 6-2 with one out of state loss and the other loss came in their district on Friday night to Campbellsville.

KHSAA had used sister-districts in the past during playoffs but will now have playoffs within the district, meaning Bell County will play 4th place Garrard County while the Engineers will be matched up against the Rockets of Rockcastle County on Friday, November 8th.

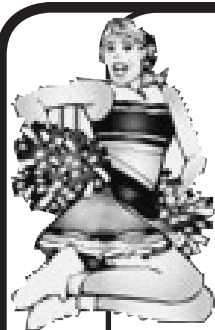
The Tigers were back in action Saturday finishing a two-game road swing in South Carolina



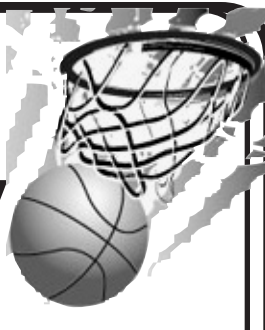
