Hunter's Hounds locate missing 14 year old girl

David Conrad of Hunter's Hounds Search and Recovery explained to the Estill Fiscal Court on Monday how the group had located a missing Lincoln County 14 year old girl on Sunday.

Conrad said the girl had already been missing for 11 days when they left Irvine on Saturday and met with her parents.

The first canine left the parents' house around 8:30 a.m. Conrad said it tracked a scent for two miles to another property. He added the other six canines followed the same scent.

The suspected property was private property, and the group was not allowed to go on it.

Conrad said a private investigator obtained permission for the group to go on properties surrounding the suspected property. On Sunday, Hunter's Hounds surrounded the sides and rear of the property where the girl was thought to be. Continued on Page 13
