In appreciation for the tremendous support that our community has shown to the Estill County Marching Engineers, they will be giving a FREE community performance on November 9th, 7:00 p.m., at the ECHS football field. Everyone is invited to come out and witness this amazing show and let them show their appreciation for the people of this town, and all that they have done to support this awesome group of young people!!

The Marching Engineers competed in the KMEA State Marching Band Championships this previous weekend in Bowling Green. The band first performed in State Semifinals at Warren Central High School with the other 15 bands who advanced from Quarterfinals. After an extremely courageous performance through high winds, the band learned that they had the overall highest score of the 16 bands in Semifinals. This again earned them a spot in State Finals (the final four) which were held Saturday evening at WKU. Estill's finals performance was simply stunning. All of the countless hours of hard work finally paid off with a nearly flawless run, and a standing ovation from the entire stadium. By the narrowest of margins, the band was awarded 2nd place with a score of 88.9. Rival Adair County was named State Champions with a score of 89.0. This was Estill's 6th State Finals appearance.

In two weeks, the Marching Engineers will travel to Indianapolis to compete in Bands of America Grand Nationals. They perform on Thursday, November 14th.
