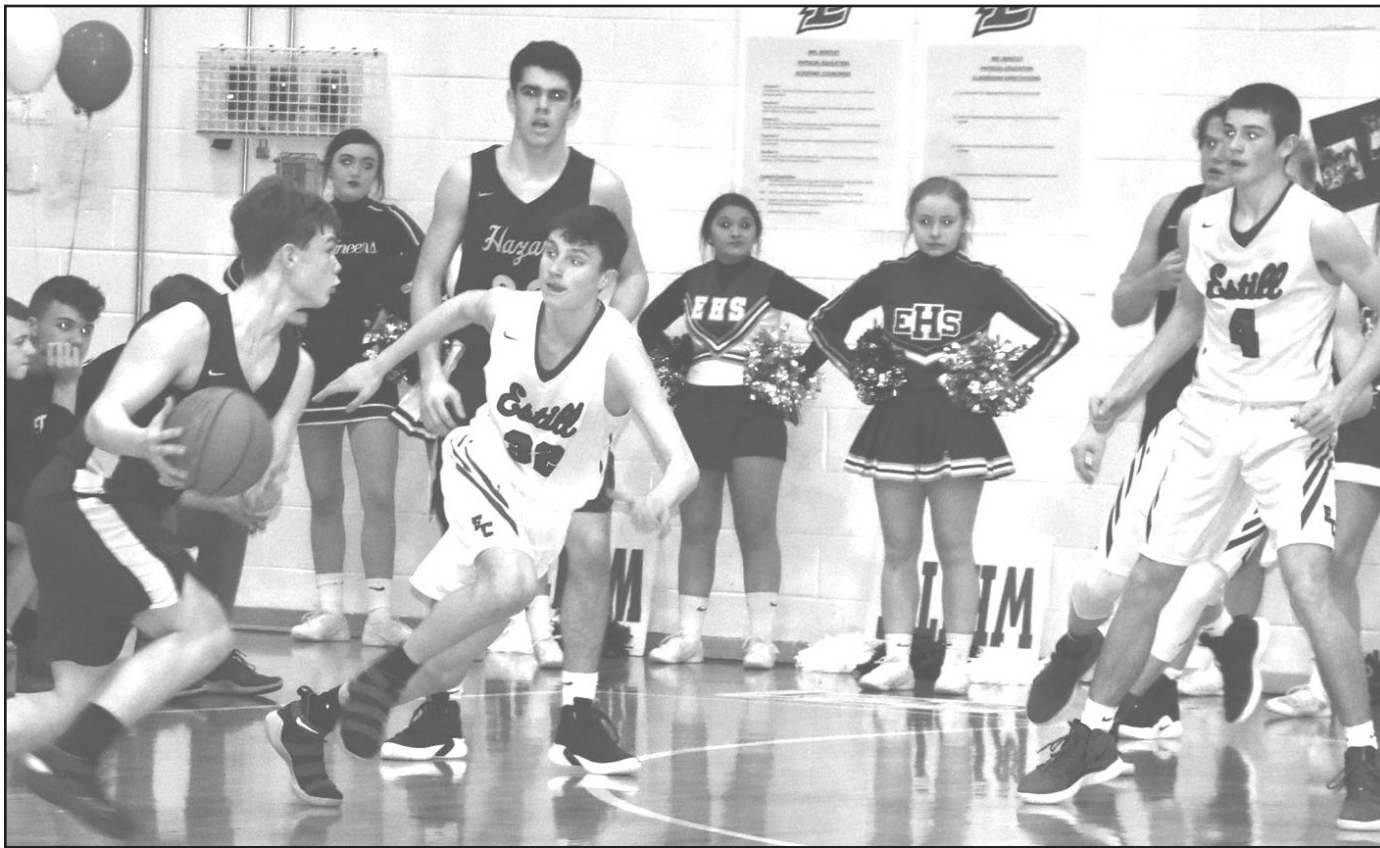

The Lady Engineers picked up a 49-37 win over LC and improved to 11-19 on the season. Amelia scored four points in this one after missing a lot of the season for injury. Freshman Mia Hale put in 14 points to lead Estill, and the Lady Engineers' other two seniors, Meagan Bellamy and Kiely Flynn, scored 8 points each on senior night. This was Estill's second straight win after a trouncing of Oneida Baptist last week. Estill faced the Owsley County Lady Owls on Tuesday night in Booneville and win there puts them in the 56th District Championship against the Powell County Lady Pirates who were 45-39 winners of the Lee County Lady Kats on Monday night. The championship will also be in Booneville on Friday, February 22nd at 7:00 p.m.

Sophomore Dyllon Long matched up well with the Bulldogs' front line and scored 19 points to lead Estill. Benton continues to pour in the points as a member of Estill's 1,000 point club with 13 against Hazard. The Engineers were in Booneville on Tuesday night to take on the homesteading Owsley County Owls in 56th District action. A win there will put them into the championship game on Thursday night at 7:00 p.m., also at Booneville, against the Powell County Pirates who easily overpowered the Lee County Bobcats on Monday night, 69-37, to improve to 11-14.
