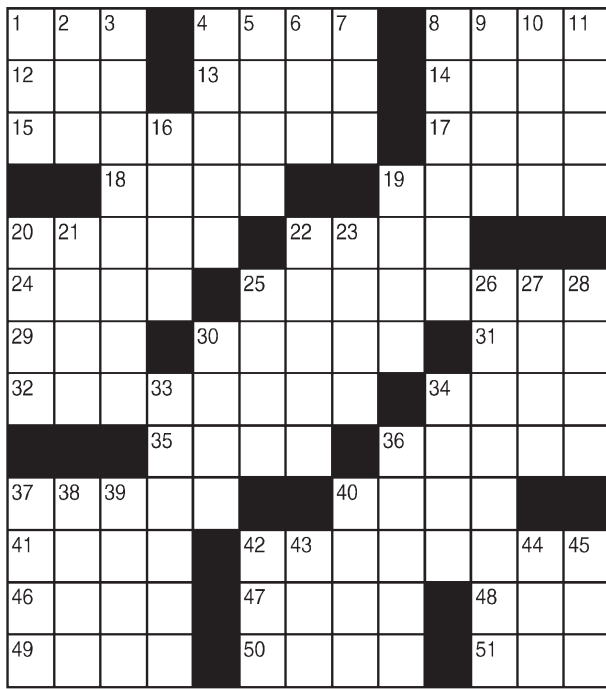

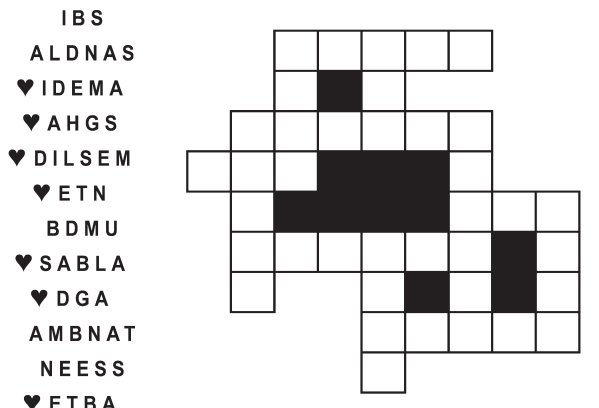

DOUBT? ... OR DARE!

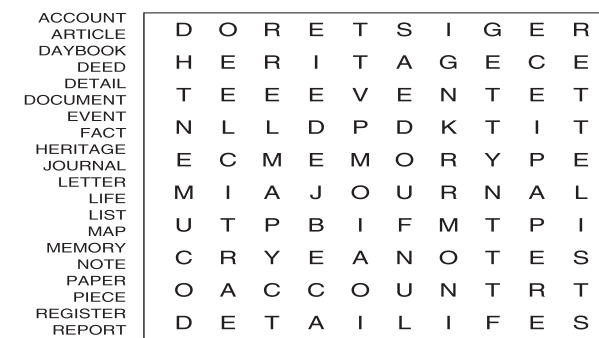

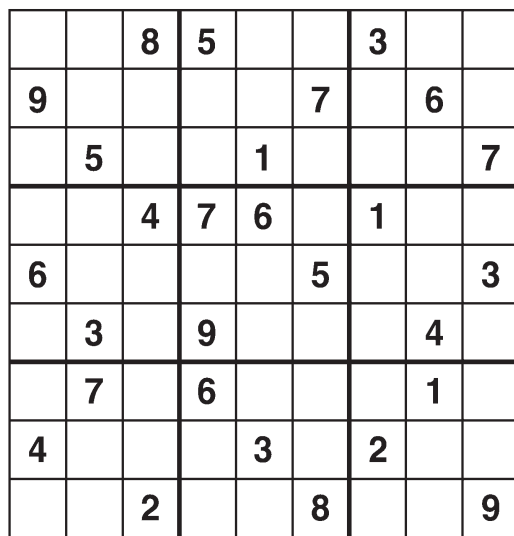
RIDDLE SEARCH - HISTORY LESSON

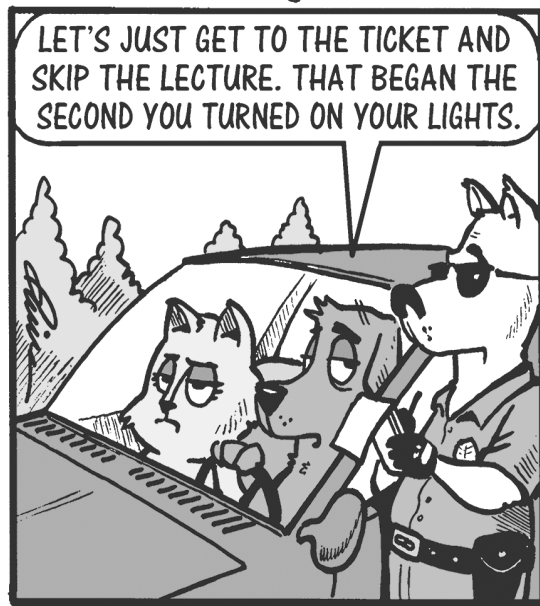

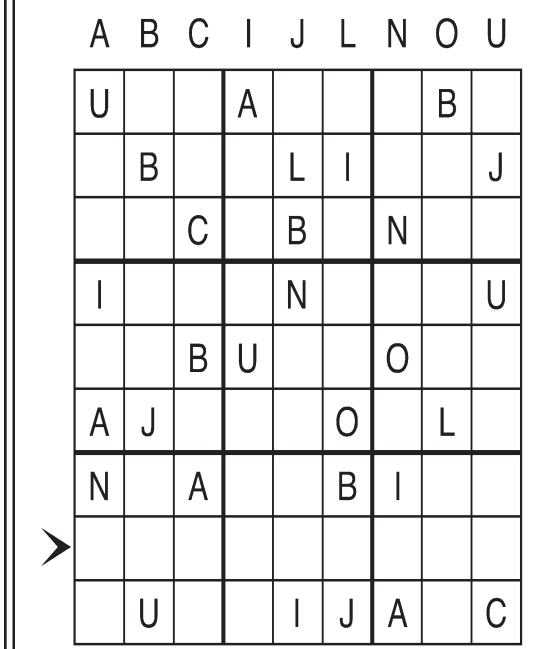

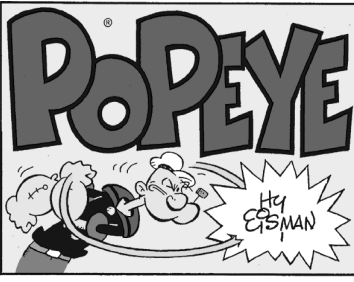
