Storytime (Wed. 10:30)

How many times have we heard this expression made in a conversation with others? Have we ever given much thought about what it really means? Some might say, 'Well, it expresses a done deal,' or 'The contract is complete.' Well, both of these would be correct, but what is the content of the message when we apply it to the Word of God? Perhaps no greater lesson can be learned from the statement except in the Bible.

First of all, the Word of God, speaking especially about concerning the New Testament, has the full endorsement of our Lord Jesus Christ resting upon it. In the New Testament, this word sign was first used by Simon in the temple, indicating that the Christ Child was to be a sign that would be spoken against even at his birth. Then in John 1:11, it says, "He came unto his own, and his own received him not." Then again in John 2:18-22, Jesus responded to the Jews when asked what sign can you give us that authorizes your miracles. Then Jesus said, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." speaking clearly of his own resurrection. Also in Matthew 12:39-40, Jesus mentions the episode of Jonah being three days in the fish's belly, to give further emphasis on the sign. What greater sign can be given among men today than Jesus Christ, the resurrected Son of God. Because upon this sign rests all the hope of mankind. So precious and reassuring are the words written in 1 Corinthians 15 when Paul spoke so clearly, plainly, that our only hope is to be found in the Living Christ. My favorite hymn is entitled, "He Lives!" Christ Jesus lives today! Yes indeed, every obedient Christian, every faithful preacher, every faithful congregation of the Lord's people that are following the teaching of the Bible, are my sign that we have that Christ indeed is living in the world today. But the imposing question is, 'Am I revealing the resurrected Christ in me?'

Secondly, the word 'sealed,' means that something secured is safely guarded. In Matthew 27:62-64, the very ones that cried for the death of Jesus, called upon Pilate to set a guard of the burial tomb of Jesus, saying, his followers may try to steal the body, and if they do, they will claim that he has indeed risen from death. So, Pilate gave consent and also put his signet ring in the soft clay as a sign that it was sealed. But, God had previously given permission for the defeat of their hopes in that on the first day of the week, Jesus arose out of the grave to live forever, deflating the efforts to keep him dead.

But, how has this forever sealed in the hearts of all men today? In John 19:34, upon the cross, Jesus poured out his life's blood at the hands of the Roman soldier. But, before it happened, the Lord had already said that this would happen. In John 6, our Lord gives us his discourse upon his death and the purpose of it. He said in Verse 7 that he would give for the life of the world. How powerful and precious are the words found in Hebrews 9, verses 11 & 25? Here, we are told they entered once into the holy place and by so doing he obtained eternal redemption for us, the sacrifice of his very body, putting away our sins by this sacrifice. Now, the question again is, 'Have you been cleansed by his blood?' In Romans 6:3-6, says they that were "baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into his *death?*" where he shed his blood. Acts 2:38 says the purpose is for the remission of sins. Galatians 3:27 says that we are identified as Christians if we have been baptized into Jesus. Colossians 2:12-14 says that baptism is a burial, a resurrection, forgiving of all your sins. This is by faith the operation of God. Have you been operated on by the Lord? Thirdly, delivered in Romans 1:26-27, David foresaw Jesus and called him 'the Deliverer' to turn them from their ungodliness, speaking of the Jesus in Jesus' day. In 2 Corinthians 1:8-11, Paul says that Christ was his deliverer when death was a threat unto him. Then in Colossians 1:12-14, here he gives thanksgiving unto redemption through the blood. Then, in 1 Thessalonians 1:18, Paul says at present he waits for Jesus from Heaven which delivered us from the wrath to come.
