Lawyer stated that he had spoke to Neal and learned that a warrant had been issued on Neal after the certified letter was sent. He said that was not the intentions of him or the officers of their department.

"The letter was intended to bring to light, the \$2,500 that our department had sent, the reason it was sent, and to financially track and account for it being sent

and carrying into the 2019 fiscal year, to year ending," it stated.

According to the letter, Neal had talked to Lawyer about four months prior to the certified letter and had explained the deposit money was tied up with an investigation. Neal offered to take out a personal note and repay Pelham Valley Fire Department, but Lawyer declined a personal repayment.

Lawyer said he has

met with the board and officers of PVFD, and they do not wish to press or pursue any kind of criminal charges against Neal or the city of Irvine.

The letter concludes saying that an agreement between Neal and the board of the PVFD had reached by a phone conversation on December 14. Neal will repay the PVFD \$2,500 within an agreed time frame.

Neal's bail was set at

\$2,500 cash. He was released from custody on 10% or \$250.00 cash.

He will be arraigned on the two latest charges on January 22.

Neal was first arrested in the summer. He was indicted on November 27 for first degree wanton endangerment, third degree terroristic threatening, two counts of theft by unlawful taking, two counts of theft by deception, and official misconduct.
