

# Police Activity Report

A bench warrant for failure to appear in Estill District Court was served on **Zachary C. Goosey**, 27, of Mockingbird Lane, Irvine on Dec. 9 by Officer Jason Conrad.

An indictment warrant was served on **Harold Patton**, 19, an Irvine homeless man on Dec. 10 by Officer Stuart Morris.

Patton was indicted in Estill County on charges of second degree burglary, two counts of theft by unlawful taking or disposition \$500 or more but less than \$10,000, and third degree burglary.

**Donald L. Stone**, 39, of High Street, Irvine was arrested Dec. 11 by Officer Morris on charges of menacing, second degree disorderly conduct, and resisting arrest.

The citation states that Stone was postured as to fight Morris and other officers. It adds that Stone was belligerent and made numerous threats to cause harm inside and outside a residence.

Morris was assisted at the scene by Officer Conrad.

Goodwin's parents reportedly told Coffey that Goodwin had kept his mother upstairs and would not let her come down until the father intervened.

Flynn said he was very fortunate that Karen Brandenburg and Sherri Cole stayed to work for him with their 20 years of experience.

Road foreman Brad Goolman stated the road department continues to maintain 274 linear miles of roads in Estill County.

A second FEMA project has been completed. He encouraged anyone with a road issue to turn in a work order.

The county renewed the prisoner contract with Three Forks Regional Jail at \$32 per day per prisoner. The county is responsible for medical bills.

Judge Watson said he has also been talking to a company that monitors inmates with bracelets, which could save money on inmate housing once it is approved. Inmates participating in that program will be required to have a phone.

Bradley Conrad was hired as a part-time jail transport officer.

Watson reported on property taxes collected in November. The school board collected the most at \$385,542.07. Other entities receiving funds were the state, county, library, health department, extension service, and ambulance service.

The county agreed to advertise for medical equipment, such as power stretchers and suction units. These items will be paid for with CSEPP funds.

Last month, the county voted to advertise for a pumper truck which will be used by the Irvine Fire Department, also paid for with CSEPP funds.

At Monday's meeting, the fiscal court approved an agreement between the county and Irvine over the pumper truck. Irvine will be required to provide insurance and maintenance on the truck per the agreement.
