A sanitation worker will be get an increase from \$8.50 hourly to \$10.70.

Supervisor for the street department will go from \$12.50 to \$12.53 per hour. A full-time worker will go from \$8.50 to \$10.70 per hour. Part-time workers will remain at \$8.00 per hour.

The salary of the fire chief went from \$15.00 hourly to \$19.74; an assistant chief goes from \$11.50 an hour to \$17.18; a captain will be paid \$11.50 an hour instead of \$10.00. The lieutenant, full time firefighter, and part-timers remain the same at \$9.50, \$8.50, and \$8.00 an hour, respectively.

Any full time or part-time firefighters who obtains a Commercial Driver's License (CDL) shall be paid \$10.00 per hour.

The salary of the police chief will increase to \$19.31 hourly from \$15.00. A captain goes from \$13.50 to \$17.65 an hour. A certified officer goes from \$11.50 hourly to \$15.00.

There were no changes for sergeant at \$12.50 an hour; a non-certified officer at \$9.50 an hour; a part-time officer at \$9.50 an hour; and parking officer at \$8.00 an

hour. The salary of the city clerk was increased from \$14.00 an hour to \$17.34 an hour. The assistant clerk stays at \$12.00 an hour, and part-time positions are \$8.00 an hour.

The employees may receive a 2% increase on their annual anniversary date, if funds are available.

Also, the employees will be given a longevity payment on December 15th, but that amount is to be set by vote of the council.

The ordinance was given second and final reading on Monday. It will become effective upon publication.
