

Lady Engineers have double-signing with pair of seniors inking with Asbury

Wednesday, April 3, 2019 was double-signing day at Estill County High School when two Lady Engineers seniors signed a letter-of-intent to play basketball for Asbury University in Wilmore, Kentucky. Head coach Chad Mayes was on hand as Meagan Bellamy and Kiely Flynn each signed to play basketball for the Eagles. The 2019-

2020 season will be the second for Mayes whose team finished 11-19 this year with a 6-12 slate in the River States Conference. Asbury moved to university status in recent years and has about 1700 students attending its campus at Wilmore. This is the second time that two players from Estill signed to play at Asbury making Bellamy and Flynn

the third and fourth Estill Lady Engineers to play for the Eagles in recent years. Former Estill standouts Cassidy Flynn, a sister to Kiely, and Julie Harris began playing for Asbury in the 2012-13 season. Harris remained on the roster for two years, and Cassidy played four years. Coach Mayes said the Asbury program is "excited to have both

of these girls" playing for the Eagles. Both girls began participation in the high school program as 7th graders and have six years with the Lady Engineers. They were two of Estill's top scorers and Bellamy put in over 1,000 career points. She made Estill's 1,000-point club on January 18th and finished with 1,184 points and 199 three-pointers.

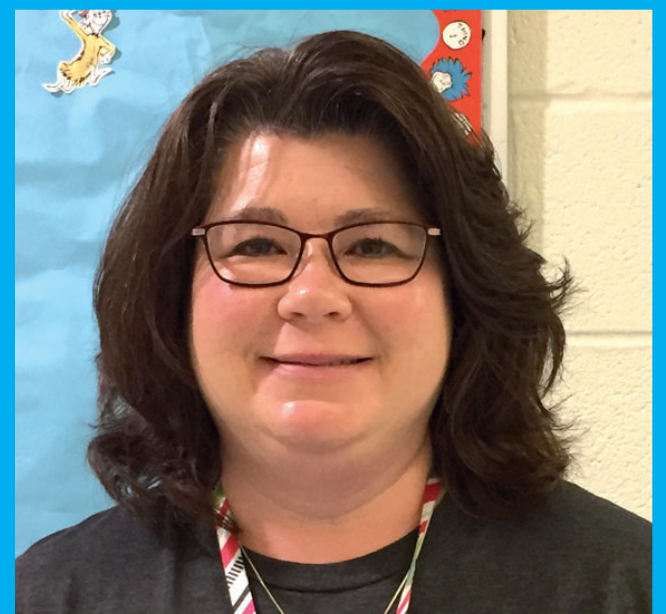
Estill County Middle School Student of the Week
