

An Afternoon with Abraham Lincoln

The Battle of Richmond Association is hosting "An Afternoon with Abraham Lincoln," chautauqua style presentation this coming Sunday, April 28, 2019, starting at 2:30 p.m. The event will be held at the Mt. Zion Christian Church located at 830 Battlefield Memorial Highway (US-421) just south of Richmond.

Larry Elliott, one of the nation's premier Abraham Lincoln presenters, will be portraying America's 16th President.

Born in Kentucky, Abraham Lincoln moved with his family to Indiana and then to Illinois as a youngster. It was in Illinois where he began making his impact as an attorney and politician. While living in Springfield, Illinois, Lincoln met and married Lexington native Mary Todd Lincoln. They had four sons, but only one, Robert, reached adulthood.

The Lincoln-Douglass debates during the election for United States Senate in 1858 are legendary. These debates thrust Lincoln into national prominence along with the issue dividing the country, slavery.

Lincoln won the 1860 election for the United States presidency as a member of the newly formed Republican party.

Unfortunately, his election and perceived views on slavery caused several Southern states to secede from the Union to form the Confederacy. With the firing by the Con-

federates on Fort Sumpter in Charleston Harbor in South Carolina in April 1861, the most turbulent four years of American history began.

Lincoln guided the nation through these dark years to a Union victory and peace. However, Lincoln's hopes of a peaceful reunification were dashed when he was mortally wounded by an assassin on April 14, 1865, dying the next morning.

Most scholars rank Abraham Lincoln as the greatest United States President up to this point.

A resident of Louisville, Larry Elliott began portraying our 16th President in the mid-2000s. He is the same height and weight as Lincoln which gives an audience a very good idea of Lincoln's physical stature and presence.

Elliott's great, great, great grandmother, Mary LaRue Enlow, was the midwife that delivered Abraham Lincoln in February 1809 in what is now Larue County, Kentucky. The National Park Service has preserved Lincoln's birthplace near Hodgenville.

Elliott has portrayed Lincoln at numerous schools and events in Kentucky and Indiana, including several in Madison County. His wife, Mary Elliott, appears with him as Mary Todd Lincoln from time to time.

A light reception will be held after the performance in the church's fellowship hall. The event is free, but donations will be accepted.

I can't remember the year, time, or place that I once had the opportunity to sample a piece of vinegar pie. I can't recall any special taste it gave me, but I do remember it was one unusual taste. I have never tried it since. Someone once said, 'Why, you can add enough sugar to a corncob and make it taste good.' Then, I have seen where, sure enough, someone did just that and called it corncob jelly. Men and their imaginations seem to never end.

But, how does this even begin to fit in a supposed article dealing with salvation? Well, some people like a little vinegar pie; some may have even acquired a taste for corncob jelly. But, in order to eat either one, they have to be sweetened up somewhat.

This is what some have done in religious teaching. They have taken the Gospel, which has some parts that are bitter and strong, and have deluded it to suit their own taste. How has this been done? For instance, the Bible name for the saved of God is church of Christ. Matthew 16:13-15 and Romans 16:16 confirm this truth. Ephesians 5:23-32 validates this truth. Read it for yourselves; see if it is there. But, to make religion suit the palate of many, they have added some of their own thoughts or ideas and altered the true recipe.

passage says that in order to follow the recipe, we must all repent of all our past sins. Luke 13:5 says "except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish."

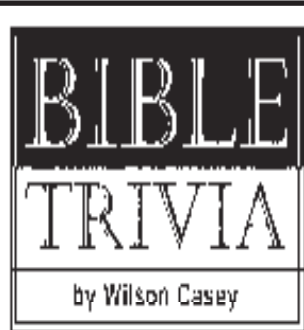

But, if you have not faithfully obeyed the plan given by our Lord to save you, then you stand in grave danger at this very moment. Why, you ask? So, you surely realize that both of these may come in an hour that we do not know or may expect.

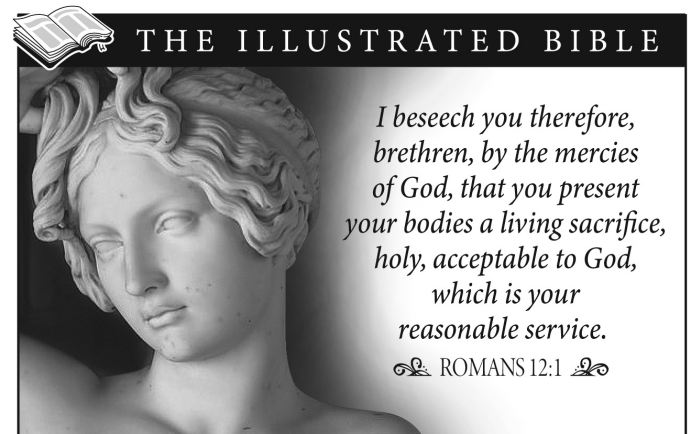

The French Government learned of his act of bravery and awarded him The Croix de Guerre - Cross of War. And his alma mater posted a plaque in his honor that read, "He played with the scrubs for four years - but never quit."
