

# Local Police Activity Report

A bench warrant from Estill Circuit Court was served on **Erville J. Townsend**, 35, of Broadway on April 13, by Officer Russell Morris.

The warrant states that Townsend violated the terms of his release by receiving new charges. No bond was set.

He was found guilty in August of theft of mail matter.

**James Coffey**, 32, of Riddle Clem Road, Irvine was served a bench warrant from Madison Circuit Court on April 14 by Officer R. Morris.

The warrant was issued for a probation violation.

Officer Morris served a bench warrant from Estill District Court on **James A. Richardson**, 48, of Evergreen Drive, Irvine.

Richardson was found guilty in 2017 of theft by deception - including cold checks and had allegedly failed to pay.

Officer Jason Conrad arrested **Cheryl Baskin**, 44, of Kirkland Avenue, Irvine on April 9.

The citation states the officer was dispatched to Main Street because a woman was standing in front of a residence and appeared to be snorting up her nose.

According to the citation, Baskin had 15 hydrocodone pills in her pocket. She was charged with possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense.

Baskin's bail was set at \$2,500 cash. She could post 10% of that amount for her release.

An Estill Circuit Court warrant was served April 10 on **Alicia Strange**, 28, of Cantrill Street, Irvine by Officer Conrad.

She was given a diverted sentence in October for re-

ceiving stolen property under \$10,000.

The warrant states that Strange violated the conditions of her release by leaving a court ordered rehab and absconding probation. No bond was set.

The warrant says Parsons failed to appear in Estill District Court on a charge of public intoxication.
