

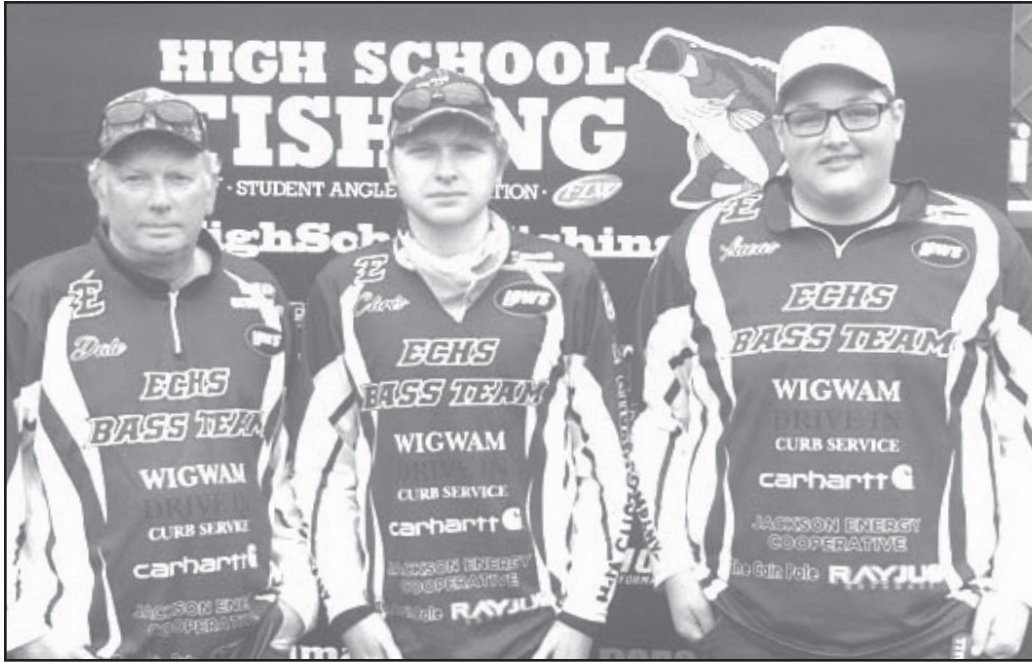
# Estill fishing teams qualify for State

The Estill County Engineers Fishing Team traveled to Cave Run lake on April 27th for their regional tournament. There was a total of 93 boats competing for a spot in the KHSAA State Tournament. The top 17 boats advanced to Kentucky Lake on May the 10-11 for a shot at the state title.

The Engineers took six boats to the region. Two of those qualified for the State Tournament. Chris Wise and Lucas Puckett finished 15th. Chase Rawlins and Micah Adams finished 2nd for a runner-up in the region. With no seniors on the team, these four junior are the leaders of this team.

The Engineers have had a tremendous year under new coach Chris Osborne with two teams qualified for the KHSAA state tournament, two teams qualified for the SAF national finals, and one remaining tournament to qualify for the KBN State which one team is locked in and another one sitting in fourth place in points is looking to qualify for this event.

## Police Activity Report

## IPD charges man with breaking into his former home

An Irvine man was charged with third degree burglary on May 1 by Irvine Police Captain John Sturniolo.

The arrested man was identified as William Boyd VanWinkle, 42, of Knoblick Road, Irvine.

The citation states that VanWinkle kicked in the back door at 217 Hood Ave, Irvine and removed a refrigerator on May 1.

The owner of the residence told the captain that VanWinkle had not paid the rent for several months and was evicted weeks ago.

The citation states that a toilet and kitchen cabinets were removed at an earlier date.

The citation states that VanWinkle was located on Chestnut Street in Irvine driving his father's Dodge Dakota pickup. The police captain said the vehicle matched the description of the vehicle which neighbors reported to law enforcement.

The citation adds that VanWinkle admitted to entering the residence and removing the refrigerator. He stated he had purchased it, and it was at his father's residence.

VanWinkle was also charged with theft by unlawful taking or disposition under \$500, and third degree criminal mischief.

VanWinkle's bail has been set at \$5,000 cash.
