Thor was indicted May 24 by the Estill County Grand Jury on two charges: prohibited use of an electronic communication system to procure a minor: sex offenses and tampering with physical evidences.

The indictment states that around Sept. 1, Thor solicited a minor for sexual activity over an electronic device. He then allegedly deleted messages from his cell phone in order to conceal evidence, which he believed was to be used in an official proceed-




