

Grand jury returns 21 indictments

The indictment says that Coffey had less than eight ounces of marijuana, 32 suboxone, 35 tylenol with codeine, and 119 gabapentin, in his possession, which he intended to sell.

It adds that he had a Ruger 9 mm handgun in his possession, along with a digital scale, plastic bags, plastic spoons, and rolling papers.

The indictment states that Coffey has been previously convicted of at least two prior felony offenses.

Capt. John Sturniolo conducted the investigation.

A five-count indictment was returned against Brandon Crabtree, 39, of Stanton.

The indictment charges him with tampering with physical evidence, fleeing or evading police, second degree (on foot), trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense, giving officer false identifying information, and first degree persistent felony offender.

According to the indictment, on Dec. 29, Crabtree put a baggie containing methamphetamine in the seat of a police cruiser to conceal evidence. The indictment states that Crabtree possessed over two grams methamphetamine with the intent to sell it.

The investigating officer was Deputy Chris Coffey.

An indictment charges James Hobbs, 32, of Wildflower Ridge, Ravenna with public intoxication, two counts of possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense, and drug paraphernalia - buy/possess.

The indictment says on January 13, Hobbs possessed heroin, hydrocodone, a cut straw and drug grinder.

Irvine Chief Brad Smith was the arresting officer.

Delphine Harrison, 58, of Dark Hollow Road was indicted on charges of possession of a controlled substance, first degree and

first offense, first degree wanton endangerment, drug paraphernalia, and trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense.

The indictment states that Harrison possessed heroin and with the intent to traffic it on March 29.

It adds that she wantonly engaged in conduct which created a substantial danger of death or serious physical injury to a seven year old child. She allegedly possessed a cut straw.

Capt. Sturniolo was the lead investigator.

Jessica Lynn Turner, 37, of Sugar Hollow Road, Irvine was indicted for drug paraphernalia - buy/possess, possession of marijuana, and possession of a controlled substance, first degree and second offense.

The indictment states that she had a meth pipe and baggie, marijuana and methamphetamine in her possession on Dec. 29.

The investigation was conducted by then Irvine Officer Colton Lewis.

Pamela Childers, 49, of 8th Street, Ravenna was indicted for possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense, third degree possession of a controlled substance, and public intoxication.

On January 31, she allegedly had methamphetamine and a xanax bar in her possession.

Capt. Sturniolo conducted the investigation.

Two indictments were returned against Casey Allen Myers, 32, of JR Furniture Road, Irvine.

The first indictment charges him with fleeing or evading police, second degree (on foot), public intoxication, drug paraphernalia - buy/possess, resisting arrest, possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, and theft by deception, including cold checks.

The indictment states that Myers had three syringes and a pink .22 caliber rifle

in his possession on Sept. 13. It adds that he obtained \$40 at Estill Gun and Pawn for the pink rifle.

The second indictment charges Myers with third degree burglary and first degree persistent felony offender.

It says he knowingly entered a garage owned by Eddie Weddington on Sept. 5.

Trooper Ty Robinson investigated both cases against Myers.

A two-count indictment was returned naming Brenda Gail Taulbee, 36, of Winchester as defendant.

The indictment charges her with possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense (heroin) and drug paraphernalia - buy/possess.

She allegedly had heroin and nine syringes in her possession on April 10.

The arresting officer was Sheriff Chris Flynn.

James Rose, 63, of South Irvine Road was indicted for trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense and first degree persistent felony offender.

The indictment says Rose sold 2.44 grams of methamphetamine to a confidential informant on March 15 for \$140.

Capt. Sturniolo was the investigating officer.

William VanWinkle, 42, of Knob Lick Road, Irvine was indicted for second degree burglary, theft by unlawful taking or disposition, and third degree criminal mischief.

According to the indictment, VanWinkle entered a residence at 217 Hood Avenue in Irvine on May 1. He allegedly took a toilet and kitchen cabinets. He caused damage to the residence by kicking in the back door.

Capt. Sturniolo was the investigating officer.

Tonya Lynch, 37, of Hoys Fork Road, Irvine was indicted on four counts of trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense and drug paraphernalia

buy/possess.

The indictment says she sold heroin and methamphetamine to a confidential informant on March 8, and again on March 12. On the second date, she allegedly had a metal spoon in her possession.

The investigation was conducted by Capt. Sturniolo.

Faye D. LaFountain, 34, of Laurel Street, Irvine was charged by indictment with reckless driving, driving on a DUI suspended license, second offense, operating a motor vehicle under the influence, fleeing or evading police, first degree (on foot), and resisting arrest.

The offenses allegedly occurred on February 17. The arresting officer was Colton Lewis.

Billie R. Wilson, 37, of Ann Street, Irvine was indicted on a single charge of trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense.

Chief Brad Smith said that Wilson sold methamphetamine to a confidential informant on January 30.

Brian Doty, 52, of Wisemantown Road, Irvine was indicted for theft by failure to make required disposition of property over \$500.

The indictment says he was paid \$6,280 on January 30, 2017 by Rebecca Flynn for labor and materials to replace the siding on her home. The indictment states that he did not complete the work or return her payment.

Sheriff Flynn investigated.

Matewood Kortbein, 41, of Cow Creek Road, Ravenna was indicted for trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense.

The indictment says she possessed over two grams of methamphetamine on January 2 with the intent to sell.

She was arrested by Chief Smith.

The other two indictments were not ready to be publicly released.

Police Activity Report

Donald L. Hagans, 28, of Wallace Circle, Irvine was charged with fourth degree assault, domestic violence on May 27 by Chief Brad Smith.

Alan Craig Martin, 41, of Winchester was charged June 2 with possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense (methamphetamine). His citation states that he was a passenger in a vehicle which was stopped for traffic.

Christopher Allen Poe, 37, of Twin Creek Road, Irvine was charged with operating on a suspended or revoked operator license and possession of marijuana (four marijuana cigarettes) on June 2.

Three bench warrants were served May 31 on **Roy A. Blevins**, 41, of Gray, Ky by Irvine Officer Stewart Morris.

A Whitley County warrant said Blevins had failed to pay \$223.00 after being found guilty of public intoxication in November.

A warrant was issued in Laurel County after Blevins allegedly failed to appear on Feb. 8. He was to pay \$184.00 or serve four days for charges of criminal trespassing third degree and public intoxication.

A Knox County warrant stated that Blevins was to serve 180 days. The reason for the warrant was not stated.

Charles T. Maness, 39, of Autumn Court, Irvine was arrested May 31 by Officer S. Morris for failure to pay on a non-support conviction.

Estill District Judge William Leach set Maness' bail at \$278.00 cash.

Officer Jason Conrad served a warrant on Jessica Rose, 36, of North Plum Street, Irvine. She has been indicted for bail jumping in Madison Circuit Court.

Lyndsey Cloyd, 20, of Richmond was charged with disorderly conduct, second degree, by Officer Conrad.

Her citation states that she was standing in the middle of Rice Street. Upon arrival, Conrad states that she started screaming, yelling, and walking away from him and

Chief Brad Smith.

Travis Cox, 29, of McKee Road, Irvine as charged with public intoxication at Hardee's Restaurant on May 26 by Officer Russell Morris.

A Lee District Court bench warrant was served on Timothy J. Purdue, 39, of Jake Road, Irvine for failing to pay \$50. He was found guilty in October of second degree promoting contraband.

Judge Leach set his bail at \$50 cash.

Two warrants were served May 30 on **Tarcia Richardson**, 50, of Old Fox Road, Irvine by Sheriff Chris Flynn.

One warrant was from Estill District Court where Richardson allegedly failed to pay court costs, fees, or fines after being found guilty in 2016 of theft by unlawful taking or disposition.

The second warrant was for a parole violation. It states that Richardson was convicted of two counts of trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense (meth). The warrant states that she has absconded her parole supervision and failed to report to her parole officer.

Deputy Chris Coffey served a warrant on Jason Scott Arvin, 42, of Waco on May 30.

Claude Willis, 29, of Sandstone Road, Irvine was charged May 30 with operating a motor vehicle under the influence on the bypass.

Deputy Colton Lewis charged **Jeffrey Dewayne Townsend**, 41, of Dawes Road, Irvine on May 29 with careless driving operating a motor vehicle under the influence. The citation states that Townsend was involved in a rollover collision on Rice Station Road. No injuries were reported.

Loretta Turner, 40, of homeles of Irvine, was arrested May 25 by Deputy Coffey. He said he went to Estill Acres to find a male wanted on a parole warrant. The male ran and hid under the trailer. When caught, the deputy said Turner started using profanity. He charged her with second degree dis-

orderly conduct.

Deputy Lewis served a warrant on **Bethany Loren Holton**, 29, of Substation Road, Irvine, on May 28. She was wanted for non-payment of court costs, fees or fines.

Felony Charges Made

Daniel Keith Damrell, 27, of Richmond was cited May 28 by Deputy Colton Lewis with public intoxication, second degree disorderly conduct, and trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree, second offense or greater.

The deputy said that Damrell was knocking on doors stating he had been in a wreck, his vehicle was stuck, and he needed help.

He said he was from Richmond but had no idea where he was, according to Lewis.

The deputy stated that Damrell had traveled down Little Buck Creek and had gotten his vehicle stuck while turning around.

During a search of the vehicle, the deputy found a pill bottle with a large crystal substance inside it. The substance weighed over six grams and appeared to be methamphetamine.

Crystal Marie Slone, 34, was arrested May 27 in Lee County on an Estill County warrant obtained by KSP Det. Toney Allen.

He said on May 2 that Slone presented proof of her employment and income from Owsley County Health Care to obtain a \$500.00 payday loan.

Allen confirmed with Owsley County Health Care that Slone has never been their employee.

She was charged with criminal possession of a forged instrument, second degree.

KSP Trooper C. Roark arrested **Roy Sturgill**, 45, of Millers Creek Road, Irvine on numerous charges on May 30 on Rison Circle.

The trooper said he was assisting Sheriff Chris Flynn to search for Sturgill, who had an active warrant for assaulting a police officer.

While looking for Sturgill, the trooper and sheriff saw him riding an ATV on

the road. They pursued him onto Pryse Road, Metcalf Road and Rison Circle.

Roark stated he lost sight of Sturgill on Rison Circle. He then saw Sturgill coming towards him, and he struck his cruiser with the ATV.

Sturgill was detained and placed in the sheriff's patrol car.

The trooper found a pill bottle of marijuana seeds on the ATV and a used syringe with blood.

Roark's cruiser sustained damages exceeding \$1,000.

He stated that Sturgill sustained a small cut to his lip and was treated at Marcum & Wallace Hospital before being lodged at the jail.

Sturgill was charged with fleeing or evading police, second degree (motor vehicle), all terrain vehicle violations, first degree criminal mischief, possession of marijuana, drug paraphernalia - buy/possess, and resisting arrest.

Anna Harper, 39, of Stevenson Road, Irvine was arrested May 30 by a Madison County deputy on an Estill County warrant.

The warrant charged Harper with criminal possession of a forged instrument, first degree.

It was obtained by KSP Trooper Derek Lovett.

It states on March 27, 2018, Harper gave a \$50.00 bill for a transaction at the Irvine McDonald's. A McDonald's employee tested the bill at the counter and it showed positive as a forgery.

The employee reportedly called law enforcement, and requested Harper remain on the premises. She allegedly left the scene and did not return.

Kara A. Moberly, 33, was arrested May 31 in Perry County on an Estill County warrant obtained by Det. Toney Allen.

The warrant states that Moberly knowingly exploited an adult in Estill County, which resulted in a loss of more than \$300 in finances or other resources, or both. The total loss was \$1,030.16.

This had left EMA unable to purchase new equipment. When EMA purchases new equipment, the fiscal court must pay for it and will be reimbursed by CSEPP and the federal government later.

Riddell was given permission to bid for two generators.

The fiscal court approved

payments to volunteer groups for litter abatement (picking up roadside litter). Watson said that money is comes from waste management funds.

Approval was given for Jailer Bo Morris to attend jailer training. He is required to complete 40 hours a year.

Watson announced that Hinkles have started black-topping county roads.

IPD cites hospitalized man to court

An Irvine man was hospitalized instead of jailed on May 26, but he still faces charges levied by Irvine Police Chief Brad Smith.

Smith received a call about a man running through yards who acted like he was intoxicated. The chief made contact with the man on Court Street but said that he was wearing no clothes.

Smith stated the man refused to follow commands and pulled away after he was handcuffed.


The citation states the man was taken to the ground for

police to gain compliance.


He was taken to Marcum & Wallace Hospital but was transferred to another hospital.

Because he was hospitalized, Johnathan M. Mager, 40, of Covey Road, Irvine was cited to court on charges of public intoxication of a controlled substance, criminal trespassing third degree, disorderly conduct second degree, and resisting arrest.


