

Trixie nods, "I'll tell you, though, I thought I was going to drop dead that third day."


"From hunger, you mean?"

EDA awards \$4 million grant for Area Technology Center

U.S. Secretary of Commerce Wilbur Ross has announced that the Department's Economic Developgrant to the Estill County Board of Education in Irvine, Kentucky, to help build an Area Technical Center (ATC) Cuts and Jobs Act designated Opportunity Zone, will be matched with \$4.7 million in state investment, and is expected to help create more than 500 jobs, retain 450 jobs, and generate \$19.4 million in private investment.

Congressman Andy Barr has been a staunch supporter of Estill County's grant application.

"The Estill County Board of Education and local officials have worked diligently to make the Area Technology Center a reality, bringing to the Sixth District a facility that will provide enhanced training opportunities in a high-need area while helping displaced coal workers learn new, highly sought after skills," said Con-gressman Andy Barr. "I applaud the Trump Adminisdiligent work in funding programs like this one to help industries."

"The Trump Administration is working diligently to provide American workers with tailored and relevant ment Administration (EDA) is awarding a \$4 million training," said Secretary of Commerce Wilbur Ross. "The new Area Technology Center, which will be located in an Opportunity Zone, will provide the training educational building. The project, to be located in a Tax needed to develop highly skilled workers that can support the region's industries."

This investment will help build a new 40,000 square foot ATC educational building for Estill County Schools. Collaborating with a regional technical college, the ATC will offer support and education to highly skilled workers that includes advanced manufacturing, health sciences, information technology, diesel technology, and other technical education for adults.

The funding announced today goes to a Tax Cuts and Jobs Act designated Opportunity Zone, which provides special incentives for further private sector participation and development. Created by President Donald J. Trump's Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017, Opportunity tration and the U.S. Department of Commerce for their Zone designations spur economic development by giving tax incentives to investors in economically-dismatch skilled workers with the needs of our region's tressed communities nationwide. In June 2019, EDA added Opportunity Zones as an Investment Priority.


