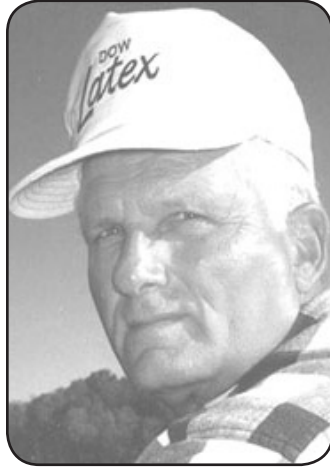
Harley "Bud" Conrad, 81

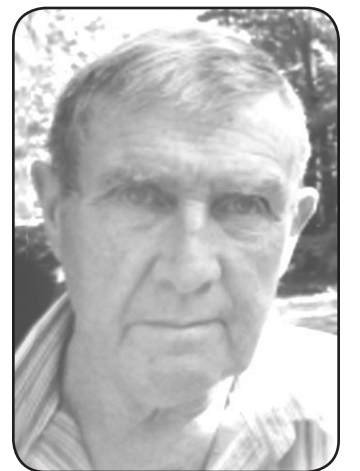
