Puckett property had been a long process but they were at the point where they could move forward with the purchase of the land. He added that KDE had sent a letter of approval and they would be accepting bids for the construction of the new bus garage and would open those bids on October 10th. Saylor said that at least ten contractors had picked up paperwork on the project and hoped that the bid was below the projected price.

A final payment of \$78,377.90 to Codell Construction for the demolition work at the old bus garage was approved by the board. The original bid price was for \$230,000 which included allowances in case they ran into problems with the soil. There was no contamination in the soil, therefore, the district received a refund for those allowances in the amount of \$81,725 which Saylor said would go back into the contingency funds.
