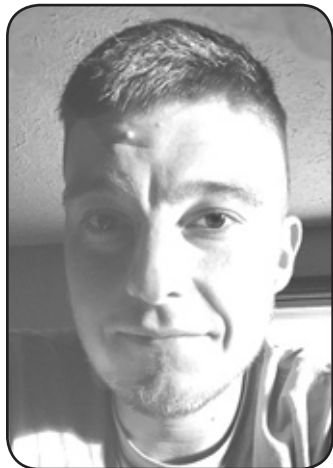
Dalton Tanner Adams, 24

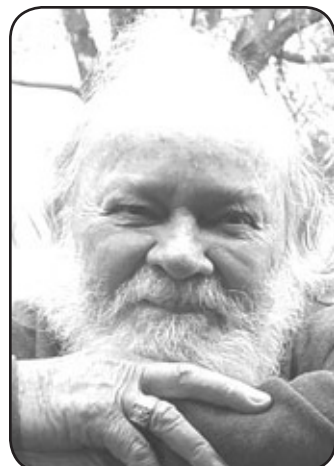
Harry Walling, 86

James William "Jim" Broaddus, age 91, of Brodhead, Kentucky, died on Sunday, September 22, 2019.

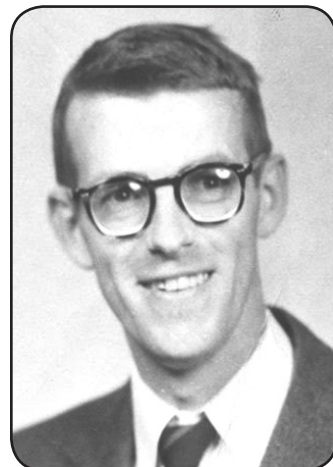
