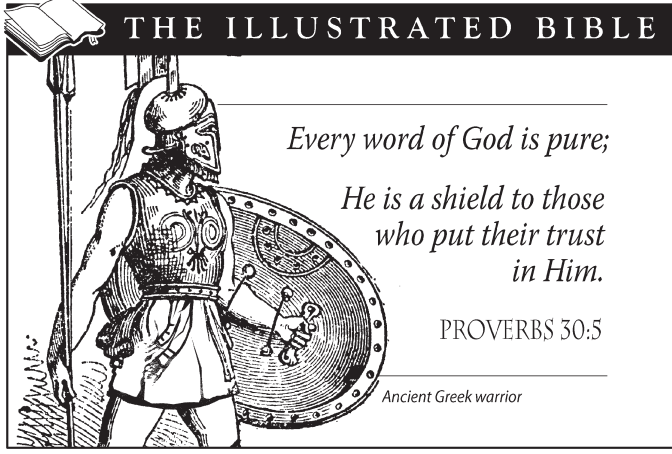
SI Christian Revival & Homecoming

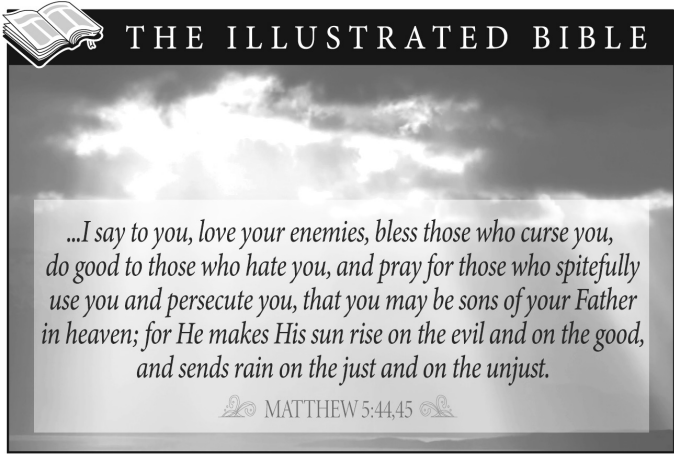
Ivory Hill Baptist Church will be having Revival and Homecoming

Religious . . . but Lost

Facts, concerning religious claimants: 85% of Americans claim to belong to some religious organization; even to the point that they may take part, or attend, a few times a year. Then, in the event of the death of a loved one, seem to take comfort in an obituary notice that they belonged to this group or that one or that they were of a religious faith. We see it all the time.

But, does this insure one's passage into the Heaven of God? We are told by the Apostle Paul in **2 Corinthians 13:5**, "*Examine yourselves, whether ye be in the faith; prove your own selves. Know ye not your own selves, how that Jesus Christ is in you, except ye be reprobates?*" (or rejects)"

Question: can your claim to eternal salvation pass the Bible test? Jesus in **John 8:31-32**, said, "**If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed; ³²And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.**" So what do you have to lose by following the truth? Well, if we fail to do so, our soul will be lost.

Again: Jesus clearly states in **Matthew 7:21-23**. Here in **verse 21**, he is giving us a future preview of the Judgment, saying, "*Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven.*" There, you have it! Not all religious claimants will be all added in Heaven. Why not? He says, only those that do the Father's will.

Jesus also sates in **Luke 6:46**, "*And why call ye me, Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say?*"

What a statement! This reveals clearly that religious people may think, without examining the Bible, that truly Heaven may be awaiting them if they have practiced some form of religion effort to some degree, having never examined their Bible to see if they followed the complete truths revealed therein.

Notice again, these religious claimants in **Matthew 7:22**, "*Many will say to me in that day, Lord,*

Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? and in thy name have cast out devils? and in thy name done many wonderful works?" But only to have Jesus say, "*I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity.*" (lawless) (**verse 24**) So, they were engaged in a religious pursuit but did not follow the divine instructions. There, you have it! So, by rejecting the plan of the Lord's and following their own plans never gained the true salvation that only awaits those that do the will of the Father.

The Apostle Paul, worried by the men who would not teach wholesome doctrines, wrote in **Colossians 2:6-7**, "*As ye have therefore received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk ye in him: ⁷Rooted and built up in him, and stablished in the faith, as ye have been taught, abounding therein with thanksgiving.*" This includes all those that were saved, but he warned them, "*Beware lest any man spoil you through philosophy and vain deceit, after the tradition of men, after the rudiments of the world, and not after Christ.*" (**verse 8**)

The definition of philosophy is: a theory, or logical analysis of the principals of conduct or thought, and rudiment is defined as: a first slight beginning of an undeveloped form.

Do you think our Lord was careless when he said in **Matthew 15:7-9**, "*Ye hypocrites, well did Esaias prophesy of you, saying, ⁸This people draweth nigh unto me with their mouth, and honoureth me with their lips; but their heart is far from me. ⁹But in vain they do worship me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men.*"

So, there you have it! So, men today are attempting to pawn off the teachings of Jesus for their own philosophies and rudiments. So, Friends, if this is your situation, this is my advice to you, 'Get your nose in the Bible for yourself. See what it says, believe only what it says, repent of your errors, and solidify your salvation by finally being baptized for the forgiveness of your sins, and continually meet with people who do the same in worship.'

So, there you have it. I hope this will be a motivation that will get you to finally read the Bible for yourself and do what it says.
