

# Fiscal court met Monday

The court says that Durbin lives 659 feet from Samantha Friend on Highway 213.

Samantha Friend said her children paid \$400 and \$600 for the dogs with their own money.

"They hunt with their dogs. They show their dogs," she stated.

She told the magistrates they would get rid of all the dogs but two. She said two are still pups and not trained yet.

The magistrates told her they have not passed a noise ordinance and she did not have to get rid of her dogs.

Attorney Riley gave the women the same advice he gave Durbin. He said they could hire a private attorney and file a lawsuit.

Minnie Friend said that someone has been firing shots toward her home across both Highway 213 and Crowe Hollow Road.

It is illegal to shoot across a road, and Riley said that is a criminal offense.

Regina Jones was introduced to the court and audience. She is a representative of U.S. Senator Rand Paul in Eastern Kentucky. She asked that constituents with problems about social security, IRS or other issues contact her or the senator's office.

Lucas Barnes briefed the court about the Bright Scholarship that he received.

Judge Watson said all FEMA sites were completed except five or six. Blacktopping remains to be done on others.

Ronnie Riddell, director of Emergency Management Agency, announced the CSEPP's annual exercise will be this Wednesday.

Watson recognized Melvin Wiseman, who recently retired after 65 years selling gas and repairing vehicles. Wiseman was not present at the meeting.

Riddell read a resolution which recognizes E911 operators as first responders.

"They are the first point of contact when an emergency arrives," Watson stated.

Jessica Stevens, tourism director, gave a report on the work of the tourism committee.

Linville Smyth asked the fiscal court to investigate a rumor he had heard regarding road department employees using county equipment on their own use. He said the equipment included back hoes, tree trimmers, and pole saws. He said the garage was even being used for private work.

Watson and the magistrates stated this was the first they had heard of it.

## Man charged with possession

A Winchester man was charged with a felony during a traffic stop on KY 89 by KSP Trooper Ty Robinson on Sept. 12.

The citation states the trooper asked the driver, 43 year old William Shane Addison, to step out of the vehicle due to it being towed.

The trooper said that Addison came back to his window, and asked about arrangements for a ride and his traffic citation.

He told Addison that he would take him to Go Time, and he could wait there for his ride.

Addison then allegedly asked if he could go back to his truck and make sure his tool boxes were locked.

The citation states that as Robinson got out of his cruiser to hand Addison the citation, he saw a white baggie that was tied off. It had crushed blue residue inside. There were still some pills inside which were not crushed up.

According to the citation, the baggie was right by Addison's feet as he was standing middle ways down to his truck. The trooper said the baggie was not there earlier.

Addison said it wasn't his and he didn't know where it came from.

Robinson charged Addison with possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense, (drug unspecified) and tampering with physical evidence.

## Sheriff Activity Report

A Beattyville man was arrested on a warrant obtained by Irvine Officer Stewart Morris on July 26.

The warrant, served by the sheriff's department, charges **James R. Griffith**, 46, with theft by unlawful taking or disposition all others over \$500 but less than \$10,000.

Officer Morris had obtained security footage from Marcum & Wallace Hospital on July 13, which the warrant says shows Griffith breaking into a vehicle around 5:35 p.m. Griffith allegedly removed property from the vehicle valued at over \$500.

The citation states that Griffith put the property into his vehicle and left the scene. Griffith's bail was set at \$1,000 cash.

Glenna D. Hurt, of Woodstrail Drive, Irvine reported fraudulent use of a credit card over \$500 but less than \$10,000 to Sgt. Josh Rison with the Estill County Sheriff's Department on Thursday.

A former friend of Hurt's had reportedly reopened a credit card account and had purchased a Dell computer costing \$3,044.00.

Hurt told the deputy that she did not authorize the purchase.

Deputy James Marshall served an indictment warrant from Estill Circuit Court on **Frankie S. Young**, 50, of Leighton Road, Irvine.

The indictment charges Young with possession of a firearm by a convicted felon.

Deputy Chris Coffey served a warrant on **Bradley Hardy**, 28, of Substation Road, Irvine on Sept. 13. The deputy had no knowledge of the case.

**Mark Nicolas Worrell**, 40, of Regis Road, Irvine, was arrested Sept. 13 on Sand Hill Road by Deputy Coffey. Worrell was charged with public intoxication and possession of a controlled substance, third degree.

The citation states that Coffey was called about Worrell walking in and out of yards at 1:40 a.m. He said Worrell had 2.75 suboxone pills in his possession.

The deputy was assisted by Irvine Officer Jason Conrad. They found the wanted man a few houses down from the original residence, where he was hiding.

Sgt. Rison said the man attempted to flee over a fence. Officers grabbed him. He fell, but continued to try to flee.

After the man was detained, Sgt. Rison said officers located an uncapped needle underneath the male.

He arrested and charged **Timothy Riddell**, 34, of Matt Riddell Road, Irvine with third degree criminal trespass, public intoxication of a controlled substance, drug paraphernalia, resisting arrest, and fleeing or evading police, second degree (on foot).

A bench warrant from Clark District Court was served on **Scott Camden**, 20, of Sand Hill Road, Irvine on Sept. 12.

It says that Camden failed to appear for review or pay fines and or court costs. He had been found guilty of theft by unlawful taking or disposition or shoplifting in 2018.

Judge C. Hardin set Camden's bail at \$50.00 cash.

**Bethany Holton**, 19, of Substation Road, Irvine was arrested Sept. 10 by Deputy Coffey during a traffic stop on the vehicle Holton was in.

Coffey charged Holton with violation of a Kentucky EPO/DVO. The citation states that she and the person who had obtained the EPO/DVO against her were in the car together

On Sept. 10, **April Richardson**, 43, of Substation Road, Irvine was cited after a traffic offense.

Deputy Coffey said he observed Richardson's vehicle passing him on the bypass and its rear license was

not illuminated.
