Madison Central has been one of the strongest bands in the state over the years in their respective class while Estill County has continued to be at the top of their class for several years. One year, both the Central and Estill bands won the state in their respective classes.

The Marching Engineers will be honing up their skills on the practice field this week in preparation for competition at Pulaski County in Somerset next week against some west-central bands. Estill will be competing in Class AAA against Wayne County, Marion County, and Glasgow. Two 4A bands, Southwestern and Barren County, will also be competing. Somerset, Danville, and Harlan will be competing in Class A, while Knox Central will be the only 2A band scheduled.


